## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,  
Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the  
Territory of New South Wales, and its De-  
pendencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c.  
&c. &c.

**W**HEREAS, by an Act passed in the pre-  
sent year of the reign of Her Majesty  
Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act to provide for  
the more effectual Administration of Justice in New  
South Wales and its Dependencies*," it is amongst  
other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the  
Governor to appoint from time to time, one of the  
Judges of the Supreme Court to reside in the  
District of Port Phillip, and by Proclamation for  
that purpose, issued with the advice of the  
Executive Council, to declare and define the  
limits of the said District within which such re-  
sident Judge shall exercise jurisdiction; and that  
within the limits so declared and defined, the said  
Judge whilst so resident therein, shall have, exercise,  
and enjoy all such and the like powers, jurisdiction,  
and authority, as now is, or are, or can be legally  
exercised by the said Supreme Court, or by all, or  
any of the Judges thereof collectively or in-  
dividually: And whereas, I, the Governor afore-  
said, have by a Commission bearing even date  
herewith, under my Hand and the Seal of the  
Colony, appointed JOHN WALPOLE WILLIS, Esq.,  
one of the Judges of the said Court, to reside in  
the said District of Port Phillip;—

Now I, the GOVERNOR aforesaid, with the  
advice of the said Executive Council, do hereby  
declare, in pursuance of the powers so in  
me vested, that the said District of Port  
Phillip shall comprise all that part of the Territory  
of New South Wales which is bounded on  
the north by the thirty-sixth degree of south  
latitude; on the east by the one hundred and  
forty-sixth degree of east longitude, measuring  
from the meridian of Greenwich; on the south by  
the waters of Bass's Straits and the Pacific Ocean,  
and on the west by the one hundred and forty-first  
degree of east longitude, from the said meridian  
of Greenwich, being the limits of the said district  
set forth in the Government Notice bearing date

at Sydney the Tenth Day of September, One  
thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, within  
which His Honor the Superintendent exercises  
the powers of a Lieutenant Governor, and that  
within the said limits the said John Walpole  
Willis as such resident Judge, or such other  
Judge of the said Supreme Court as may here-  
after be duly appointed to reside therein, shall have  
exercise, and enjoy the powers, jurisdiction, and  
authority, which are conferred by the provisions of  
the said recited Act.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS, by an Act passed in the Session  
of Parliament, held in the third and  
fourth years of His late Majesty King William  
the Fourth, intituled "*An Act to regulate the Trade  
of the British possessions abroad*," it is, amongst  
other things enacted, that the several ports therein,  
in that behalf mentioned, shall be free warehou-  
sing ports, for all the purposes of the said Act;  
and it is thereby further enacted, that it shall be  
lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, from  
time to time, to appoint any port in His Majesty's

possessions in America to be a free warehousing port, for all or any of the purposes of the said Act, and that every port so appointed shall be, for all the purposes expressed in such Order, a free warehousing port, under the said Act, as if appointed by the same.

And whereas, Her Majesty doth deem it expedient to appoint the port of New Amsterdam, in Berbice, a free warehousing port under the said Act, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained;—

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities in Her Majesty by the said Act in that behalf vested, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said port of New Amsterdam, in Berbice, shall be a free warehousing port, for all the purposes of the said Act.

Provided always, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing herein contained shall exempt any goods, wares, or merchandise, imported from the said Port of New Amsterdam into any of the British Possessions in the West Indies, or on the Continent of South America, or into the Bahama Islands, from the payment of the duties now chargeable thereon in such places under the said Act.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**ITH reference to the Government Notice of the 21st ultimo, respecting the disposal of Crown Lands in the Southern or Port Phillip District,—His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that the following PORTIONS OF LAND in that District, which have been previously advertised at upset prices not exceeding twenty shillings an acre, will, on and after the 1st day of March next, be open to selection at the fixed price of twenty shillings an acre, in the manner pointed out in the above notice.

As these Lands were measured and marked out previously to the recent alteration in the Regulations, it is to be distinctly understood that they will be sold and eventually granted, subject to the right, on the part of the Crown, of forming such Public Roads as may be required at any time hereafter, which will, however, be the *only* reservation made in the grant.

##### QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

1 All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent., and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent., has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of 3lbs., and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3½lbs. each, and baked 24 hours before being issued.

3. The Fresh Meat for the military Ration, shall be in the proportion of 5lbs. of Beef and 2lbs. of Mutton weekly; deliverable alternately in fore and hind quarters, when the quantity admits of it; for the Convict Rations the Beef shall be delivered in the same manner; Salted Beef being issued only in summer to Road Parties, and when authorised.

4. The Maize Meal shall be similar in quality to the Wheaten Meal, and shall be twice ground.

5. The Vegetables for the Hospitals and other Establishments entitled thereto, shall be supplied in reasonable proportions of Potatoes, Greens, Pumpkins, Onions, &c.

The Rum shall be West India, five per cent. under proof.

##### MODE OF DELIVERY.

6. ##### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

9. The whole of the supplies of every description in each District are to be included in one Contract; and, therefore, no Tenders will be received unless for supplying the whole without exception that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each district there must be a separate Tender.

10. Provisions and Forage being required by Rations according to scales under these respective heads, the Tenders are to express the price per Ration only, and not of the several Articles, excepting that of Rum, the price of which must be separately stated.
