PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief, of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same. &c., &c., &c.,

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty KING GEORGE THE FOURTH, intitled "An Act to provide for the administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, and for the more effectual Government thereof, and for other purposes relating thereto," it was, amongst other things enacted, that every Law or Ordinance to be passed by the Governor of New South Wales with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, should, within six months from the date of such Law or Ordinance, be transmitted by the Governor for the Time being of the said Colony, to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State for the time being; and that it should, and might be lawful, for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, from time to time, as He or They should think necessary, to signify through one of His or Their Principal Secretaries of State, His or Their Approval or Disallowance of all such Laws and Ordinances: and that from, and immediately after the Time when such Disallowance should be published in the said Colony by Proclamation to be for that purpose issued by the said Governor, all such Laws and Ordinances should be null and void;—And whereas certain Acts or Ordinances were passed during the Third Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA, by the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, intitled respectively, "An Act to amend an Act intitled, An Act for Registering Deeds and Conveyances in New South Wales, and for other purposes; and to prevent Convicts under Sentence from Acting as Conveyancers," and "An Act to allow the Aboriginal Natives of New South Wales to be received as competent witnesses in Criminal Cases;" and, "An Act to enable the Proprietors of a certain Banking Company, carried on in the Town of Bathurst, in the Colony of New South Wales,

under the name, Style, and Firm of "The Bathurst Bank" to sue and be sued in the name of the President of the said Company for the time being; and for other purposes therein mentioned,"—And Whereas the Right Honorable Lord John Russell, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State has signified in two several despatches bearing date respectively, the tenth day of June and the eleventh day of August, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty, and addressed to the said Governor, Her Majesty's Disallowance of the said Acts;—Now I, SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, the Governor aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation declare, that the said Acts are null and void accordingly.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the present year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to provide for the more effectual administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation under His hand, issued and published from time to time, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the same, to direct Circuit Courts to be holden in or at such Towns or places within the Colony, as he shall by the advice aforesaid think fit to appoint, and to fix from time to time.

Now, therefore, I, the GOVERNOR aforesaid, with the advice of the said Executive Council, do hereby determine and appoint that Circuit Courts for the Trial of Criminal as well as Civil Issues, shall be holden at the several and respective places, and on the days and times herein-after respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

At the Town of Maitland to the north, on Monday, the 5th April, and on Monday, the 6th September, 1841, and on the first Mondays respectively in the months of March and September in each and every subsequent year.—At the Town of Berrima to the south, on Wednesday, the 14th of April, and on Wednesday, the 15th September, 1841, and on the second Wednesday respectively following the first Mondays in the months of March and September, in each and every subsequent year.—At the Town of Bathurst to the west, on Monday, 26th April, and Monday, the 27th September, 1841, and on the fourth Mon-

days respectively of the months of March and September in each and every subsequent year.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct, that the following ORDER IN COUNCIL, respecting the Duties payable at the CAPE OF GOOD HOPE, be re-published from the London Gazette, for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 10th day of August, 1840.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's most excellent Majesty in Council.
WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, made in the session of Parliament, holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations touching the trade and commerce of, to, and from any British possession on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limits of the East India Company's Charter, excepting the possessions of the said Company, as to Her Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary:—

And whereas by an order in Council of the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, made in pursuance of an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," certain duties of Customs are imposed upon goods imported into the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and it is expedient to repeal the said duties, and to impose other duties of Customs in lieu thereof, Her Majesty doth, therefore, with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in Her as aforesaid, by the said recited Act of Parliament, order, and it is hereby ordered, that, upon goods, wares, and merchandise imported into the Cape of Good Hope, the duties imposed by the

said order in Council shall cease and be no longer payable; and that, in lieu of the same, there shall be levied the several duties set forth in the table hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

shall come into operation from the time when the
same shall be made known in the said Colony by
a Proclamation of the Governor of the said Colony :

And the Right Honorable the Lords Com-
missioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give
the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CONVEYANCE OF COALS FROM NEWCASTLE TO SYDNEY.

QUIT-RENTS.

IN conformity with the intimation given to the Legislative Council, that a portion of the Sum due for Quit-rents had been included in the Ways and Means of the year 1841, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that all persons indebted to the Government on account of Quit-rents will be required to pay the same—in whole or in part—during the present year, according to the following arrangement, viz:—

1. Collectors will be appointed in each District, and will be instructed to demand on the 1st April next, the amount payable for the year 1840, together with an equal amount (where due) for arrears of former years.

2. If these amounts be paid within three months from the day on which they are demanded, no further payment will be required until the year 1842, when a similar demand will be made of the Quit-rent for 1841, with an equal amount for the arrears due on 31st December, 1839.

In future years a demand will in like manner be made, of double the amount due for the year immediately preceding, until all arrears be liquidated, when the amount stated in the Deed of Grant will alone be demanded yearly.

3. If not paid within three months from the date of the first demand, the Collectors will be authorised to proceed by distress, or arrest; and in every such case the whole amount due will be levied at once.

4. For such Sums as the Collectors may obtain, they will be allowed five per cent. if the money be paid voluntarily, and ten per cent. if recovered by distress or arrest.

5. Such persons as, before the 1st of April next, may pay into the Treasury at Sydney the amount proposed to be levied in the present year, will be allowed a Discount of Five per cent., being the percentage that would otherwise be paid to the Collectors.

6. During the present year, 1841, but not afterwards, all persons whatever will be permitted to redeem their Quit-rents, whether for Town Allotments or Portions of Land, and whether the Deed of Grant contain any covenant for redemption, or not, on payment of ten years' rent and all arrears due, into the Treasury.

In such cases, the Discount of Five per Cent will be allowed on the arrears, if paid before the 1st of April next, but not on the sum paid for the redemption of the Rents.

QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

- 1 All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.
2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent., and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent., has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of

3lbs., and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3½lbs. each, and baked 24 hours before being issued.

3. The Fresh Meat for the Military Ration shall be in the proportion of 5lbs. of Beef and 2lbs. of Mutton weekly; deliverable alternately in fore and hind quarters, when the quantity admits of it; for the Convict Rations the Beef shall be delivered in the same manner; Salted Beef being issued only in summer to Road Parties, and when authorised.

4. The Maize Meal shall be similar in quality to the Wheaten Meal, and shall be twice ground.

5. The Vegetables for the Hospitals and other Establishments entitled thereto, shall be supplied in reasonable proportions of Potatoes, Greens, Pumpkins, Onions, &c.

The Rum shall be West India, five per cent. under proof.

MODE OF DELIVERY.

6. No part whatever of the Supplies above specified shall be received in charge of the Commissariat, but shall all be delivered by the Contractor direct to the Parties or Establishments entitled thereto, upon the written order of the Commissariat Officer in charge of the District, or of the Person authorised for that purpose.

7. At the several fixed Stations the Rations for the Troops, the Convict Establishments, and Road and other Parties, shall be delivered by the Contractor at the Barracks, Establishments, or Huts where the Parties to be supplied may be stationed; being previously to removal from the Contractor's Premises approved by a Person authorised for the purpose.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

9. The whole of the supplies of every description in each District are to be included in one Contract; and, therefore, no Tenders will be received unless for supplying the whole without exception that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each district there must be a separate Tender.

10. Provisions and Forage being required by Rations according to scales under these respective heads, the Tenders are to express the price per Ration only, and not of the several Articles, excepting that of Rum, the price of which must be separately stated.

11. Fuel and Light, as well as the supplies for Hospitals and Penal Settlements, being required by Weight and Measure, must be priced accordingly, as shewn under these heads respectively.

12. Contractors supplying Road Parties on the Bathurst or other roads similarly situated, shall have at all times on the spot a supply for

fourteen days in reserve, in the care of a competent Agent to whom reference may be had in the Contractor's absence.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the Party receiving the supply as to its quality, the same shall be decided in the following manner:—The Party objecting shall name one Person as Arbitrator, the Contractor or his Agent another; these two shall (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as Umpire, who, in the event of the Arbitrators not agreeing in the opinion, shall be called upon for his decision, which shall be final. And should it be decided that the article is not of proper quality, it shall be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing which it shall be procured and the expense charged to his account.

14. It shall be in the power of either Party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving in writing a notice of three calendar months to the opposite Party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made.

15.
