HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the Notices dated 5th December, 1840, 21st January, and 4th March, 1841, respecting the disposal of Land, be re-published in a collective form, for more convenient reference.

IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, that, in pursuance of Additional Instructions under the Royal Signet and Sign Manual, bearing date the 22nd day of May, 1840, and of directions issued in conformity therewith, by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Colonial Land and Emigration Board, the present Territory of New South Wales is, for all purposes connected with the disposal of Land, to be divided into three Distinct Portions or Districts, under the names of the Northern, the Middle, and the Southern Districts.

The Northern District will commence at the mouth of the River Manning, and comprise the lands lying to the Northward of the Counties of Gloucester, Durham, Brisbane, and Bligh. But the Northern boundaries of this District are not yet defined.

The Middle or Sydney District will comprise the Nineteen Counties described in the Government Order, dated the 14th day of October, 1829, and the Proclamations dated respectively the 22nd day of May, and 27th day of November, 1835, extending on the east from the mouth of the River Manning to the mouth of the River Moruya. and bounded on the north by the northern boundaries of the Counties of Gloucester, Durham, Brisbane, and Bligh; and on the south by the southern boundaries of the Counties of St. Vincent and Murray, and thence by the Rivers Murrumbidgee and Murray, to the eastern boundary of the Province of South Australia.

The Southern or Port Phillip District will comprise all Lands lying to the southward of the southern boundary of the Middle or Sydney District, as described above, and to the eastward of the eastern boundary of the Province of South

Within the Northern District, the principle of selling Lands at an uniform price, as hereinafter more particularly described in respect to Port Phillip, is to be applied as soon as the necessary arrangements have been completed by Her Majesty's Government, of which due notice will be

Within the Middle or Sydney District no change whatever is made by the present regulations in the disposal of land; the method of sale by Auction being continued at an upset price, that is never to be less than twelve shillings sterling an acre.

In the Southern or Port Phillip District the following course is to be observed, viz ;-

poses, with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned, are to be open to purchase, after survey, at one uniform price, which is fixed for the present at one pound sterling an acre.

Allotments in Towns in which sales by auction have already taken place are to continue to be sold by auction. Melbourne, Williams' Town, Geelong and Portland, fall within this principle.

In such other Towns as may be established hereafter, Allotments will be open to purchase at an uniform price which is fixed for the present at one hundred pounds sterling an acre.

No reservation is to be made of Minerals, except in very special cases, where mines of great value are known to exist. The Deeds of Grant are to convey to the purchaser everything below and everything above the surface.

Purchasers will not, of course, be allowed to pay any indefinite number of Pounds sterling, and receive a corresponding number of acres, but must buy in lots of such size as shall, from time to time, be established by public regulation. Measures will be taken to keep the surveys, as far as possible, in advance of the demand for land; and Charts will be exhibited in an Office at Melbourne, to be appointed for that purpose, showing all appropriations and reserves, and the surveyed lands still open for selection.

All purchases must be made at the Land Office of the District in which the lands are situated, and the money paid into the Local Treasury of that District. Purchasers, however, coming out from the United Kingdom will be allowed to deposit money with the Agent-General for the Colonies, or such other Officer as may be appointed for that purpose, and thereupon to receive an order from the Land and Emigration Commissioners, entitling them, on production of the same to the Local authorities, to obtain credit for a corresponding sum, in the acquisition of Land. They will be allowed also, to bring out to the Colony a proportionate number of labourers upon Bounty, under such regulations as shall be established.

His Excellency the Governor directs it further to be notified, that the Lands open to selection in the Port Phillip District will be proclaimed from time to time, but that in conformity with the advice of the Executive Council, no Lands which have either been advertised at a higher upset price than One Pound sterling an acre, or are situated within a distance to be hereafter fixed, of the Towns of Melbourne, William's Town, Geelong, and Portland, will be open to purchase under the preceding regulations, until further directions are received from Her Majesty's Government.

As soon as the necessary arrangements are completed for carrying these regulations into effect, a further notification will be made for general information

the following Regulations for the Sale of Land in | the Southern or PORT PHILLIP District, viz:

1. All Lands hitherto advertised at any time for sale by Auction in the Port Phillip District, at an upset price not exceeding twenty shillings an acre, and which are at present unsold, will, on and after the 1st day of March next, be open to selection at the fixed price of twenty shillings an acre, in the manner hereinafter described.

2. Persons wishing to select Land must previously pay to the Sub-Treasurer at Melbourne any number of Pounds Sterling, not less than the number of acres which they intend to select; for which they will obtain receipts from the Sub-Treasurer. Such Receipts will be dated and numbered in the order in which they are given, and will entitle the holder to priority in the selection of Land, as is hereinafter explained.

3. The holder of a Land Receipt when he wishes to make a selection of Land, must deliver the same at the Land Office, at Melbourne, or other Office to be appointed by His Honor the Superintendent of Port Phillip. No selection of Land will be entertained unless accompanied by such Receipt.

- 4. All selections must be entered by sealed Tender, by filling up a printed form, which will be supplied at the Land Office. A separate Tender must be sent in for each Lot as advertised, and the Lot must be described in the same way as it has been previously described in the advertisement. The Tender must be endorsed "Selection of Land," and addressed to the Senior Surveyor, resident at Melbourne, and deposited at the Land Office in a box, (which will be provided for that purpose,) between the hours of eleven o'clock and three o'clock daily, (Sundays excepted.) The Tenders will be opened at the latter hour precisely, in the presence of a Board, which, for the present will consist of the Senior Surveyor resident in the district, the Sub-Treasurer, and the Police Magistrate of Melbourne, or in the absence of any of them, of such other Members as may be appointed by his Honor the Superintendent. The Board will make an immediate report to the Superintendent upon each Tender received, and upon his Honor's approval thereof, or otherwise, the selection will be either confirmed or disallowed, and the party apprised accordingly.
- 5. Each Tender must contain the Christian and Surnames at full length, and the residence of the party in whose favor the Deed of Grant conveying the Land is to be made out, in which no alteration will be subsequently allowed. It is also distinctly to be understood, that no selection once approved as in conformity to the Regulations, will, under any pretence, be allowed to be changed.
- 6. The Deeds of Grant will be made out as soon as practicable, and when executed by His Excellency the Governor, and recorded in the proper Offices, will be transmitted for delivery at the Land Office, at Melbourne, of which Notice will be given in the Government Gazette, and the local newspapers.
- 7. The Lot or Lots selected may contain a less number of acres than the number of pounds stated in the Land Receipt, but must never contain more.
- 8. If the number of acres selected be less than the number of Pounds stated in the Land Receipt, the difference or ba'ance will remain as a credit 21st January, 1841, detailing the mode in which

at the Land Office in favor of the Holder of the Receipt; and in such case the Receipt will be returned to the Holder, with an endorsement, specifying the extent to which it has been used.

9. In the event of two or more selections of the same Lot of Land being made on the same day, the person whose Land Receipt may bear a prior date and number, will be entitled to the Lot: but if the selections be not made on the same day, priority of selection alone will be considered, without regard to priority in the date or number of the Land Receipts.

10. Two or more Land Receipts may be tendered in satisfaction of the same selection; but in such case, if any question arise as to priority of selection. such question shall be decided according to the date of the last of the Receipts so tendered.

11. Land Receipts will be transferable; but they must be transferred by endorsement as in Bills of Exchange. The last person to whom any Receipt may be endorsed, will be considered the Holder of it, and it will be received at the Land Office from him only.

12. Any person holding one or more Land Receipts, wishing to delay his right of selection, may do so indefinitely; provided that the selection when made shall be in conformity in all respects with the Regulations at such time in force, including the then price of Land.

13. Land Receipts granted in England, will be considered to bear date next after any that may have been granted in the Colony on the same day, without reference to the time at which the Holders of them may arrive in the Colony.

14. No portion whatsoever of the Money paid on account of Land, will under any circumstances be returned.

15. Additional Lands will from time to time, be advertised as open to selection, a notice of at least three months being always given, as is the practice when Lands are sold by Auction.

16. Lists of the Lands open to selection and maps of the same will be exhibited at the Land Office, and they will also be sold at a reasonable

17. Lists of Lands sold will also be hung up at the Land Office, in order that it may be known that such Lands are no longer open to selection; and a similar intimation will be made to the public in the Government Gazette, or the local newspapers.

18. Retired Officers, entitled to remission in the purchase of Land, will be allowed a priority of selection, according to the date of the Certificate, granted under the regulations applicable to them. Such Certificates will be considered to take effect next after the Land Receipts dated the same day, whether granted in the Colony or in the United Kingdom. If a Land Receipt be also tendered in satisfaction of the same selection, the latest date of either must be taken in deciding on the priority of selection, if otherwise claimed.

ITH reference to the Notices from this Office, dated the 5th December, 1840, and ordinary purchases of Crown Lands are to be effected in the PORT PHILLIP District, His Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Regulations respecting SPECIAL SURVEYS in that District.

1. Any holder of a Land Receipt to the extent of not less than 5120 acres may, if he think fit, demand a Special Survey of any Land, not hereinafter excepted, within the District of Port Phillip, whether such Land Receipt be obtained in the manner pointed out in the Government Notice of the 21st January last, or granted by the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners, in London.

- 2. Any person who may desire to have a Special Survey must deliver his Land Receipt to the Senior Surveyor resident at Melbourne, describing at the same time, the Land which he is desirous of having; and in doing this, he must not only give a general description of the Land, but must be prepared when called on to point out to a Government Surveyor the exact spot on the ground itself from which the Survey is to commence, or by which it is to be regulated. All such selections must be made by sealed Tender, in the same form and manner as directed in the 4th paragraph of the Regulations of 21st January, 1841, with respect to Lands already surveyed and open to Sale.
- 3. The Land for which a Special Survey may be required must always consist of a regular unbroken area or block of Land, within a continued boundary. The block can never contain more than the following proportion of frontage measured upon any River, Watercourse, Lake, or other boundary, which by the custom of the Colony, has hitherto been, or may reasonably be, considered water-frontage,-that is to say, not more than the proportion of one mile of such frontage for every four square miles of area, the frontage, however, being measured in the usual way, and not made to follow the sinuosities of Coasts or Rivers. If both sides of the River or other boundary be taken, each side will reckon as water-frontage, and the other boundaries fixed by any Special Survey, must be straight lines running from north to south, and from east to west, and must coincide, as far as possible, with the ordinary Section lines of the Colony, in all situations where such Section lines may have been established.
- 4. No Land which may have been surveyed and proclaimed open to selection by ordinary Purchasers, on or before the day on which a selection may have been made for a Special Survey, can be included in such Special Survey.
- 5. No Land whatever within five miles of any of the Towns of Melbourne, Geelong, William'stown, or Portland, can be included within the limits of a Special Survey; all such Lands having, in pursuance of the recommendation of the Executive Council, been already reserved from sale, and the instructions of Her Majesty's Government sought as to the way in which they are to be disposed of.
- 6. In determining the order to be observed in granting Special Surveys, the Government will be guided by the same rules as are established by the Public Notice of the 21st January last, for giving No. 20. March 12, 1841.—2

priority in the selection of Lands for purchase:—that is to say, when the descriptions of any Lands asked for as Special Surveys be lodged on the same day, the holder of the Land Receipt of the earliest number and date will be entitled to priority; but if the descriptions be lodged on different days, priority in the lodging of the descriptions will alone be considered in fixing the precedence of the Special Survey. The mere lodgment with the Senior Officer of the Surveyor General's Department, of a demand for a Special Survey, unaccompanied by a description of the Lands asked for, will give no precedence.

7. The usual right of opening roads through any part of the land will be reserved to the Crown, but no other reservations whatever will be in-

serted in the Deeds of Grant.

8. Her Majesty having directed that Reserves shall be made of sites for Towns likely to be the seats of a local administration of Government, or sites on good harbours, which may be expected to become considerable Sea-ports, it is to be distinctly understood that if, on examination of the locality in which a Special Survey may be demanded, it shall appear that any land proper to be reserved for such purposes is included within the proposed limits, a reservation of such land will be made to the extent which may be requisite for giving effect to the above instructions.
