NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC,

And Instructions to all Postmasters.

IN conformity with an Act passed during the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the Regulation of the Duties of Postage," and with the Warrant of the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, the following Alterations, &c., in the Rates of Postage, &c., have taken place.

Printed Votes and Proceedings of Parliament sent from any part of the United Kingdom to any of Her Majesty's Colonies by *Private Vessels*, and all printed Votes and Proceedings of the Colonial Legislatures sent to the United Kingdom by *Private Vessels*, are liable to the following Rates of Postage.

For any Weight, not exceeding 4 Ounces.	2d.
If exceeding 4 Ounces, and not exceeding 8 Ounces	4d.
If exceeding 8 Ounces, and not exceeding 12 Ounces	6d.
If exceeding 12 Ounces, and not exceeding 16 Ounces.	8d.
And for every additional 4 Ounces in Weight, and any lesser Weight than 4 Ounces.	2d.

Postmasters are particularly enjoined to bear in mind, that this only applies to those Votes and Proceedings of Parliament, and of the Colonial Legislatures, which are sent or received by *Private Ship*.

Letters for parts Abroad, posted with Stamps of less value than the proper postage of such Letters, if pre-paid, and if addressed to places to which

pre-payment is not compulsory, must be forwarded, charged with the full Amount of Postage to which they would be liable if no Stamps were affixed thereto: but if addressed to places to which pre-payment is compulsory, they must be sent to the Dead Letter Office as at present.

Petitions and Addresses forwarded to Her Majesty are exempt from Postage.

Members of each House of Parliament are allowed to receive by the Post, Petitions and Addresses to Her Majesty, and Petitions addressed to either House of Parliament not exceeding 32 oz. in weight, exempt from postage, provided such Petitions and Addresses be sent without Covers or in Covers open at the sides.

Soldiers' and Sailors' Letters when received from Parts beyond the Seas without the Postage of One Penny having been pre-paid, (the present restriction to $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. in weight remaining in full force) are subject to a rate of Two-pence only.

Soldiers' and Sailors' Letters are not liable to any additional Postage on Re-direction.

Soldiers' and Sailors' Letters when sent or received by private Ships, are liable to the Ship Letter Gratuities, in addition to the Postage.

The Act of Parliament expressly directs, that no Letter shall be sent by Post, containing any explosive, or other dangerous material or substance, and Postmasters will give every Publicity to this enactment.
