IMMIGRATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased, in accordance with instructions received from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct it to be notified, with reference to the Regulations, dated 3rd March, 1840, that parties claiming Bounties for Emigrants will be required to report to the Emigration Commissioners in Great Britain, or to their Agents at the out-ports, the number, the names, the sexes, the ages, and the occupations of the various Emigrants whom they are about to remove.

On receiving the reports required by the foregoing paragraph, the Commissioners, or their Agents, will inspect and communicate with the Emigrants; and if they shall be satisfied that they are persons corresponding with the terms prescribed in the Regulations of 3rd March, 1840, and that they have not been induced to quit their homes by any fraud or misrepresentation, and that the vessel in which they are about to sail is sea-worthy, well-found, duly-provisioned, and of proper dimensions, the Commissioners, or their Agents, will deliver to the master of the vessel, a certificate to that effect.

Without the production to the Emigration Board at Sydney, or Port Phillip, of the certificate from the Commissioners, or their Agents, before-mentioned, Bounties will not be paid for any Emigrants who may arrive in pursuance of permissions hereafter granted.

GRANTS OF LAND.

THE following descriptions of GRANTS OF LAND, with the names of the persons to whom they were originally promised, or by whom they are now claimed, are published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

It is requested that *within one month* from the present date, the particulars required by the Government Notice of the 1st October, 1838, may be accurately furnished to this Office, viz:—

Surname and all Christian names of the person in whose favor the Deed is to be prepared, written at full length, his residence, and the intended name of the property.

If these be duly furnished and satisfactory, and if no Caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, the Deeds will be prepared accordingly, as soon as possible after the expiration of the stated period of one month.

If the required particulars be not furnished within that period, or if a Caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty arise, which cannot be satisfactorily determined by the Government the case will be referred to the Commissioners of Claims, and the parties subjected to the expense of that proceeding.

Case No. 918.—Richard Brooks, of Denham, Representatives of

Three roods and thirty-one perches, County of Cumberland, *parish of St. Peter*, Town of Campbelltown, allotment No. 69; bounded on the north-east by a street, being a line bearing east 44 degrees 35 minutes, south 4 chains; on the south-east by allotment No. 46, being a line bearing south 44 degrees 15 minutes, west 2 chains and 36½ links; on the south-west by allotment No. 68, being a line bearing west 45 degrees 34 minutes, north 4 chains; and on the north-west by Lindsay-street, being a line bearing north 44 degrees 15 minutes, east 2 chains and 36½ links.

This land was located on an authority of Governor Darling, dated 10th November, 1827, in favour of Richard Brooks, now deceased, whose Representatives are to shew to whom a Deed of Grant should now issue.

Case No. 919.—James Byrnes, of Parramatta, Auctioneer.

Seventy perches, County of Cumberland, *parish of St. John*, Town of Parramatta, allotment No. 2 of section No. 25 A; bounded on the south by Tunk's allotment, south 83 degrees, west 308 links; on the west by a line north 25½ degrees, west 154 links; on the north by a line north 84 degrees, west 296 links; and on the east by the Windsor Road, south 31 degrees, east 85 links, and south 25 degrees, east 70 links.

In 1831 Thomas Fernall was found in possession of this allotment; his claim was admitted by Governor Darling, and the description was inserted in the Gazette Notice of 12th January, 1832, preparatory to the making out of a Deed of Grant for him. He, however, it appears, sold to Nicholas Caviol, who is now in Newcastle Gaol, but has assigned all his property to Byrnes.

Case No. 920.—George Wilson of Sydney, opposed by John Terry Hughes, of Sydney, Merchant.

Thirteen perches, County of Cumberland, Town of Sydney, *parish of St. Lawrence*, allotment No. 6 of section No. 6; bounded on the south by William Peckham's No. 5 allotment, bearing east 3 degrees 45 minutes, north 106 links; on the east by William Love's No. 9 allotment bearing north 3 degrees 45 minutes, west 75 links; on the north by Margaret Adcock's No. 7 allotment bearing west 3 degrees 45 minutes, south 106 links; and on the west by Castlereagh-street, bearing south 3 degrees 45 minutes, east 75 links.

On the 18th May, 1831, the above description was inserted in the Gazette, preparatory to the making out of a Deed of Grant for James Palmer, who was found in possession. He, it is alleged, sold to Wilson, and his name was announced as a claimant in the Gazette of 10th July, 1832. How Mr. Hughes claimed, does not appear, by the Notice of 24th December, 1833; the case was referred to the commission, but as no memorial was filed, nothing was done.

Case No. 921.— Thomas Barnes, of — by his Attornies, Messrs. Carr and Rogers.

One hundred acres, situate in the County of Roxburgh, parish of Thornshope, near Meadow Flat, about 1 mile east of Edward Hazard's 300 acres, on the south side of the new line of road to Bathurst; bounded on the north by a line west commencing at a marked tree on the road side 28 chains; on the west by a line south 30 chains; on the south by a line east 38 chains; and on the east by a line north 20 chains to the new line of road to Bathurst; and on the north-east by that road.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 28th June, 1831, in favour of Peter Macpherson, who, it is alleged, has sold to claimant, but cannot be found.

Case No. 922.—Stuart Donaldson, of Sydney, Merchant, on behalf of the Port Philip Association.

Twelve several portions of Land, situate in the County of Grant, in the parish of Gherineghop, containing, respectively, 962, 812, 928, 1450, 992, 640, 640, 640, 802, 990, 801, 759.

These Lands were obtained by the Association on a remission of £7,000, allowed by the Secretary of State, and a balance of £919 7s. has been paid. It is to be determined in what manner and to whom a Deed or Deeds of Grant should issue.

Case No. 923.—William Owen Davis, John Hodges, and John O'Meara, all of Parramatta, as Executors.

Forty acres, county of Cumberland, parish of St. John; bounded on the west by Prospect Creek and Sherwin's line, bearing north 15 degrees east 17 chains; on the east by Young and a line south 18 degrees east 37 chains; and on the south by part of J. Small and a line west 18 degrees south 15 chains to Prospect Creek.

The above description was inserted in the Gazette Notice of 15th December, 1834, page 883, preparatory to the making out of a Deed of Grant for Hughes and Hoskings, who were reported as the proprietors. Byrne alleges that in 1835, the allotment was devised to him by his late father Michael Byrne.
