TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A FREE PARDON.

HEREAS it has been represented unto His Excellency the GOVERNOR, that several attempts have been made to set fire to the premises of Major Darvall, at the Field of Mars; And whereas there is reason to believe that the last attempt, and one at least of the preceding ones must have been the wilful act of an incendiary,—Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Twenty-five pounds will be paid to any person or persons, if frec, who may give evidence that shall lead to the discovery and conviction of the offender; and that if such evidence be given by a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Free Pardon.

THIRTY POUNDS REWARD,

A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Government that Patrick Curran, who stands charged with Murder and other capital felonies, effected his escape, on the 6th instant, from escort, on his way from Picton to Sydney, and is still atlarge,—Ilis Excellency the Governor

directs it to be notified, that a reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall apprehend the said Patrick Curran and lodge him in any of Her Majesty's gaols; and that if the said Patrick Curran be apprehended and secured by a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such prisoner of the Crown.

And with a view to the more speedy capture of the said offender, His Excellency is further pleased to direct that an additional reward of Ten Pounds shall be paid to any person who shall apprehend and lodge him in security before the 1st day of May next.

H IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that the following Regulations are to be observed with respect to the assignment of Male Convicts, viz:—

1. No application for the Assignment of Convicts will be received after the 10th of May next.

2. No Assignment of Convicts to private service will be made after the 1st day of July next, except to replace such men as may be withdrawn for some special purpose of Government, or to replace men to whom Conditional Pardons or Tickets-of-Leave are issued, as rewards for assistance rendered by them to the Police, or for other good services to the public.

3. After the 1st of July next, should there be any Convicts at the disposal of Government mor e than are required for the purposes of Government, their labour will be given to persons or parties who may be associated for any purpose of public utility, such as the opening of new, or the repair of existing roads, the formation of dams, or breakwaters, the improvement of harbours, the construction of bridges, or the erection of watch-houses, and other police buildings.

In all such cases, however, the parties to whom



the labour of the Convict is given, will be required to lodge, feed, and clothe them, as well as to provide for their proper superintendence.
