HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bill, about to be brought under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

No. 1.—*A Bill to continue, for five years, an Act passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act further to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, and to provide the means of defraying the expense of a Border Police."*

As the above recited Act, 2 VICTORIA, No. 27, will expire on the 1st day of July, 1841, it is proposed:—

That the said Act be continued for five years from that date.

That the 14th section, which enacts, that the brands of different proprietors shall be distinct, and be registered with the Commissioner; and the 15th section, which enacts, that all unbranded beasts above one year old shall be impounded, branded, and sold, unless the owner prove his right of property within twenty-one days from and after the impounding of the same; shall be made to extend to all parts of the Colony.

That the Commissioners, and persons acting under them, shall be empowered to impound Cattle found straying on Crown Lands *within the boundaries.*

WITH reference to the notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd January last, respecting Washing at the Factory, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that when articles are delivered at the Factory, and taken away again, by the owners, at their expense, the charge for Washing will be reduced from 2s. per dozen to 1s. 6d.

These prices, however, will only apply to cases in which the entire washing of families is sent, or when the articles sent are such as to give only fair average trouble in washing or ironing; when articles only are sent which require more than ordinary care or trouble, the charge will be increased accordingly.

Sixty-one and one half perches, county of Cumberland, parish of St. John, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 18, on the north side of Aird-street, in section No. 6; bounded on the east by a line 2 chains 15 links; on the north by a line 1 chain 80 links; on the west by a line to Aird-street 2 chains 12 links; and on the south by that street 1 chain 80 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane for 21 years, from 30th, June 1823, to Martin Sweney, now deceased, who, it is alleged, sold to claimant. A deed is prayed for on proposing to pay a fine equal to 21 years quit-rent, as provided for by a clause in the case.

Case No. 958.—John Higgs, of Parramatta.

Forty-five perches, county of Cumberland, parish of the Field of Mars, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 5, on the north side of Grose-street in section No. 16; bounded on the west by a line 2 chains 35 links; on the north by a line 1 chain 16 links; on the east by a line to Grose-street 2 chains 31 links; and on the south by that street 1 chain 22 links.

This allotment was leased by Sir Thomas Brisbane, for 21 years, from the 30th June, 1823, to Thomas Whitfield, now deceased, who, it is alleged, sold to Patrick Leonard, who sold to John Pong Shyong, who sold to claimant. The deed will be prepared subject to the payment of a fine equal to 21 years of the quit-rent, as provided for by a clause in the lease.

Case No. 959.—Martha Sharpe, of Richmond.

Bristol Arthur Albion, (1), 32, Sussex, stocking weaver 5 feet 5½ inches and upwards, ruddy fair comp. light brown hair, grey eyes, from Stockade, Woolloomooloo, since 13th June, 1840.
