COUNCIL.

IS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct, that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under consideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command, E. DEAS THOMSON.

No. 1 .- " A Bill to amend An Act, intituled, " An Act to authorise the establishment of Markets in certain Towns in the Colony of New South Wales; and for the appointment of Commissioners to manage the same."

The Act, 3rd VICTORIA, No. 19, authorising the establishment of only one Market in any of the Towns coming under its operation, - It is proposed to authorise the establishment of two or more Markets in such cases as the same may be applied for by the Inhabitants; the manner of making such application, and the regulations of such Markets when established, to be in accordance with the provisions of the existing Act.

No. 2 .- " A Bill to prohibit Shooting for Sport or Pleasure on Sunday."

The Lord's Day being frequently profaned by persons carrying Fire Arms, and Shooting for Pleasure on Sunday, it is proposed, - That no Person shall carry Fire Arms, or Shoot for Pleasure on Sunday, under Penalty of not more than Five nor less than Two Pounds. Proposed Act not to apply to Constables, or other persons carrying Fire Arms bona fide for protection of life and property.

IS Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bill, about to be brought under con-

sideration of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

No. 1 .- A Bill to continue, for five years, an Act passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, " An Act further to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, and to provide the means of defraying the expense of a Border Police."

As the above recited Act, 2 VICTORIA, No. 27, will expire on the 1st day of July, 1841, it is proposed :-

That the said Act be continued for five years from that date.

That the 14th section, which enacts, that the brands of different proprietors shall be distinct, and be registered with the Commissioner; and the 15th section, which enacts, that all unbranded beasts above one year old shall be impounded, branded, and sold, unless the owner prove his right of property within twenty-one days from and after the impounding of the same; shall be made

to extend to all parts of the Colony. That the Commissioners, and persons acting under them, shall be empowered to impound Cattle found straying on Crown Lands within the boundaries.

These prices, however, will only apply to cases in which the entire washing of tamilies is sent, or when the articles sent are such as to give only fair average trouble in washing or ironing; when articles only are sent which require more than ordinary care or trouble, the charge will be inversed accordingly.
