A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that George Wilson, a Prisoner of the Crown, by the ship *Moffatt*, who effected his escape from off the chain at Maitland, while awaiting his trial on the 4th February last, at the Quarter Sessions, for being illegally at large with Fire Arms in his possession, and for Horse Stealing, is still at large, committing depredations on Liverpool Plains, and also near the Township

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 17th September, 1829, in favour of David Allan. John Tyre, as the attorney of David Allan, requested the deed of grant, to be made to Hughes and Hosking. The description was inserted in the Gazette notice of 18th May, 1839, page 601, No. 291, in the name of the promisee.

Case No. 994.—Thomas Onus, of Richmond.

One hundred acres, county of Hunter, parish unnamed, allotment No. 2; commencing at the eastern extreme of the north boundary line of John Eaton's 100 acres grant, and bounded on the south by that line bearing west 45 chains, and a continued west line of 13 chains; on the west by a north line of 20 chains; on the north by an east line of 45 chains to the Woolombi Brook, upwards, to the eastern extreme of the north boundary line of John Eaton's grant aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 24th November, 1830, in favour of George Eaton, now deceased, whose heir-at-law, Daniel Eaton, has sold to claimant.

Three acres three roods and thirty perches, county of Cumberland, parish of Willoughby, No. 7 of the Whaling allotments at Neutral Harbour; commencing at the north-west corner of allotment No. 6, and bounded on the south-east by a line west 32 degrees 30 minutes, south 6 chains; on the south-west by the road 9 chains; on the north-west by a line east 32 degrees and 30 minutes, north 6 chains and 20 links to the Neutral Harbour; and on the north-east by that Harbour to the north-west corner of allotment No. 6 as aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling, dated 28th May, 1829, in favour of John M'Laren, who is now in England. The description was inserted in the Gazette notice of 7th September, 1839, page 993, No. 592, in the name of the promisee.

Case No. 999.—Messrs. John Terry Hughes and John Hosking, of Sydney, merchants.

Two thousand five hundred and sixty acres, county of Brisbane, parish of Melbourne, partly on Kingdon Ponds; bounded on the north by a line commencing at a marked tree bearing west 240 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 107 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 240 chains; and on the east by a line bearing north 107 chains to the marked tree aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling's, dated 12th March, 1827, in favour of Archibald Little, who, it is alleged, sold to John McLaren, who sold to claimants. The description was inserted in the Gazette notice of 30th November, 1839, page 1352, No. 732, in the name of the promisee.

Case No. 1000.—Eleanor Chiodettie, by her husband, V. Chiodettie, and children of Larkin.

Twenty-three and a half perches, county of Cumberland, town of Parramatta, allotment No. 1 of section No. 9; bounded on the east by Marsden-street 1 chain 20 links; on the north by William Davis' allotment 1 chain 20 links; on the west by G. Who claims, or is entitled to the other portion, does not appear.

Fifteen hundred acres, county of Durham, parish of Uffington, commencing at the north-east corner, and bounded on the north by a west-line by compass of 220 chains; on the west by a south line by compass of 80 chains; on the south by an east line by compass of 143 chains to William's River, and on the east by William's River to the south-west corner of Reynold's farm, and by the west boundary of that farm to the north-east corner aforesaid.

This land was located on an order of Sir Thomas Brisbane, dated 12th November, 1825, in favour of William Fisher, who is now absent from the Colony. The description was inserted in the Gazette notice of 10th February, 1840, page 150, No. 5, in the name of the promisee.

This land was located on an order of Governor Darling, dated 10th August, 1829, in favour of James Black, who, it is alleged, sold to claimant. The description was inserted in the Gazette notice of 9th September, 1840, No. 85, page 901, erroneously in the name of John Black instead of James.

Jackson Robert, Lloyds (2), 27, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, waterman, 5 feet 5 inches, ruddy and freckled comp., dark brown hair, brown eyes, scar left side upper lip, near the nose, brown natural mark on breast, and eight stars inside lower right arm, boats arm, nine daggers, half moon, sun, m p R J lower left arm, half moon and several small stars back of left hand, ring each finger of same, from Government Boat's Crew, Sydney, since July 18, 1839.

Knight John, Earl Grey (2), 42, Stafford, coachman, 5 feet 8½ inches, ruddy comp., brown hair, grey eyes, eyebrows partially meeting, large raised mole right cheek, scar both sides of jaw, arms hairy, from Immigrant's Quarters, Sydney, since November 30, 1838.

Knight John, Dunvegan Castle, 29, London, butcher, 5 feet 5 inches, ruddy, freckled, and pock-pitted comp., brown hair, brown eyes, KSJHS, glass, and pipes on right arm, under a colonial sentence and in possession of his certificate of freedom for his original conviction, from Stockade, Campbell Town, since 4th December, 1840.

Morrissey Edward, Borrodino, 33, Kilkenny, clerk, 5 feet 7½ inches, sallow comp., brown hair, hazel eyes, at large with a pass from the Police Magistrate, Bathurst, since July 1834.

Owen Herbert, Exmouth, 33, Carnarvonshire, top sawyer and woodman, 5 feet 7½ inches, ruddy comp., light brown hair, brown eyes, perpendicular scar over right eye, scar on nose, scar on right side of chin, from custody of a Constable, Singleton, since 23rd March.
