PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain General and Governor in Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the ninth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "*An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, and for the more effectual Government thereof, and for other purposes relating thereto.*" it was amongst other things enacted, that every Law or Ordinance to be passed by the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, should, within six months from the date of such Law or Ordinance, be transmitted by the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State for the time being; and that it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, from time to time, as He or They should think necessary, to signify, through one of His or Their Principal Secretaries of State, His or Their approbation or disallowance of all such Laws and Ordinances; and that from and immediately after the time when such disallowance should be published in the said Colony by Proclamation to be for that purpose issued by the said Governor, all such Laws and Ordinances should be null and void: And whereas a certain Act or Ordinance was passed during the fourth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, by the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled "*An Act to prohibit the Aboriginal Natives of New South Wales from having Fire Arms or Ammunition in their possession without the permission of a Magistrate.*" And whereas the Right Honorable Lord John Russell, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has signified in a Despatch, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and addressed to the said Governor, Her Majesty's

disallowance of the said Act:—Now, I, Sir George Gipps, Knight, the Governor aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, declare that the said Act is null and void accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Parramatta, this seventeenth day of February, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and in the fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
