ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD;

oR,

A'FREE PARDON AND PASSAGE TO ENGLAND.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 23rd of February last, a party of six or more Europeans surprised a number of Aboriginal natives, sleeping in a tea-tree scrub, in the immediate vicinity of the station of Messrs. Smith & Osbrey, in the Portland Bay District, and then and there barbarously murdered three Aboriginal females and one male child, by gun or pistol shots, besides wounding a fourth female; - His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that a Reward of One Hundred Pounds will be paid to any Free person or persons (except the actual perpetrator) who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the parties guilty of the above crime; and if the party giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Free Pardon and a Passage to England to such Prisoner of the Crown.

T having been represented to the GOVERNOR that a District exists to the Northward of Moreton Bay, in which a fruit-bearing Tree abounds, called Bunya, or Banya Bunya, and that the Aborigines from considerable distances resort at certain times of the year to this District for the purpose of eating the fruit of the said Tree: —His Excellency is pleased to direct that no Licenses be granted for the occupation of any Lands within the said District in which the Bunya or Banya Bunya Tree is found. And notice is hereby given, that the several Crown Commissioners in the New England and Moreton Bay Districts have been instructed to remove any person who may be in the unauthorised occupation of Land whereon the said Bunya or Banya Bunya Trees are to be found. His Excellency has also directed that no Licenses to cut Timber be granted within the said Districts.
