HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct that the general objects of the following Bills, about to be brought under consideration

of the Legislative Council, be published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command, E. DEAS THOMSON.

No. 1.—A Bill to further continue, for a limited time, an Act, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Constitution of Juries, and for the Trial of Issues, in certain cases, in the Supreme Court of New South Wales."

Whereas the Act, 2 WILLIAM IV., No. 3, as amended and continued from time to time by various other Acts, will expire on the 30th June, 1842, it is proposed further to continue the same, as so amended, until the 30th day of June, 1844.

No. 2.—A Bill to further continue, for a limited time, an Act, intituled, "An Act for preventing the extension of the Disease, commonly called the Influenza or Catarrh, in Sheep and Lambs, in the Colony of New South Wales."

Whereas the Act, 2 VICTORIA, No. 12, as continued by the Act, 4 VICTORIA, No. 27, will expire on the 9th day of October, 1842, it is proposed further to continue the same until the 9th day of October, 1844.

No. 3.—" A Bill to authorise the election of Directors of Police and Public Works in the Colony of New South Wales, and to provide, by Assessment, for the maintenance of a Police, and for the construction and repair of Public Works or Buildings within the same."

It being considered expedient that provision should be made for the better maintenance of a Police force, and for the construction and repair of Highways, Roads, Bridges, and other Public Works or Buildings, within the Colony of New South Wales, it is proposed:—

That in every Police District, "DIRECTORS OF POLICE AND PUBLIC WORKS" shall be elected.

proportion to the population of the District,-that is to say, where the population of a District shall be less than 7,000 souls, the number of Directors shall be nine; 7,000 and not more than 10,000, twelve; 10,000 and not more than 20,000, fifteen; and 20,000 and not more than 40,000, twenty-one; -the Governor being empowered, on application from the majority of the Magistrates resident in any District, to reduce the number of Directors for such District,-to twothirds the number it would be entitled to by population, provided such reduction be notified in the Government Gazette.

That meetings for the election of such Directors shall be holden on the second Tuesday in the month of February, in each year, at such place in each District, as the Magistrates in Petty

Sessions assembled shall appoint.

That every male inhabitant of every such district, of the full age of twenty-one years, possessed of property to the amount of £500, or being in the actual and bond fide occupation of premises within such District, of the yearly value of £20, shall be entitled to vote at such Elections, if duly registered.

That no person shall be entitled to vote, who shall be more than six months in arrear for any rate authorised to be levied under the proposed

That no person shall be qualified to be elected a Director, unless he possess, in his own right, or in that of his wife, real or personal property of the value of £1,000 at least.

That the Magistrates in Petty Sessions assembled, or the majority of them, shall appoint some proper person to preside at each election, and also two Assessors to assist such Presiding Officer, together with Police Clerks and other necessary Officers.

That every election shall be had before such Presiding Officer and Assessors-the voting to commence at nine o'cleck in the forenoon, and finally close at four o'clock in the afternoon of the same day; and every person entitled to vote, may vote for any number of persons not exceeding the number of Directors then to be elected.

That the presiding Officer may erect, or hire rooms to be used as Booths, and appoint Clerks

to take the Poll thereat.

That no person shall be admitted to vote, unless he shall have registered his qualification within thirty days before the day of election, by declaration at the Petty Sessions for the District; and the Clerk of the Bench shall enter in a book the christian and surname of every person making such declaration, with the substance of such declaration, giving a certificate of the registry of such declaration to the party making the same, if he shall require it, on payment of a fee of one shilling.

That on some convenient day, not being more than thirty, nor less than ten days before the second Tuesday in the month of February, as aforesaid, a Meeting of the Magistrates of each District shall be held for the revision of the Register of Voters; and the revised lists shall be exposed to public view for the space of at least seven days prior to the day of election.

That no enquiry shall be permitted at any election, as to the right of any person to vote,

That the number of such Directors shall be in I to be made by the presiding Officer, in order to identify the party offering to vote.

That the presiding Officer and Assessors shall examine the voting papers, and declare those persons to be elected who shall have the greatest number of votes; and within one week from the day of the election, the presiding Officer shall cause the names of the persons elected to be published in the Government Gazette.

That the persons so elected shall not act as Directors until they shall have made the declaration in the proposed Bill contained, except to administer such

declaration one to another.

That every qualified person elected to the office of Director shall accept the same, by making the declaration hereinbefore mentioned, within ten days after notice of his election, or pay to the Treasurer to the Directors of the district a fine of £50, unless he shall be under any of the disabilities in the proposed Bill enumerated.

That the bankruptcy, &c., of any Director shall immediately disqualify him for office, but on obtaining his certificate, or payment of his debts in full, he shall be eligible for re-election, if

otherwise qualified.

That if any disqualified person shall act as Director, he shall forfeit £50, to be recovered in

the Supreme Court.

That if such election be not had in any district on the second Tuesday in the month of February, in any year, as aforesaid, by reason of the nonappointment by the Magistrates, or of the death, or absence of, a presiding Officer, it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint a person to act as Presiding Officer, and another to act as Assessor, and to fix some day within the three months next following after the said second Tuesday in February, for holding the election.

That one-third of the number of Directors elected for each district shall annually go out of office by rotation; the first so to go out of office being those who were elected under the proposed Bill by the smallest number of votes; and the Directors who shall so go out of office in the year following, being those who were elected by the next smallest number of votes; the majority of the whole number of Directors always determining, when the votes for any two or more of such persons shall have been equal, who shall be the persons so to go out of office; and thereafter the Directors who shall so go out of office, shall always be those who have been for the longest period in office without re-election; such persons being, however, eligible to be immediately re-elected, if otherwise qualified.

That so often as any vacancy shall occur in the office of Director in any district, such vacancy shall be filled up by the same course as for an ordinary election; but no Director, so elected, shall remain in office longer than the period the person in whose stead he is elected, would have held office.

That it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause any Police District to be divided into sub-districts, on application from the Justices of such district, in Petty Sessions assembled, and, with the advice of the Executive Council, to fix the proportionate number of Directors to be elected by each division.

That it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause any two or more districts to be united together, for except such as is authorised by the proposed Bill, I the purposes of the proposed Bill, on application from the Justices of the respective districts, in | district; and the Treasurer shall pay such monies, Petty Sessions assembled.

That the Directors, elected as aforesaid, for each district, shall be a Body Corporate, having perpetual succession, and a common seal, and may sue, or be sued, under the name of the "DIRECTORS OF POLICE AND PUBLIC WORKS," for the district of

That the Directors for each district shall nominate, from among themselves, a Chairman, whose name shall be recorded, on oath, in the Supreme Court, within thirty days after his nomination.

That the Directors may appoint all necessary Officers to the Corporate Body, and assign salaries to them.

That all Surveyors, appointed by the Directors under the proposed Bill, shall have the like powers, &c., as are conferred on Surveyors by the Act, 4 WILLIAM IV., No. 11.

That the Directors may enter into contracts for any thing appertaining to their duties, under the proposed Bib, provided no Director shall have personal interest therein.

That the Directors may order and direct the levying of rates, on property within their respective districts; and, for that purpose, shall cause an accurate valuation to be made of all property therein, including all cattle, horses, and sheep; and such valuation shall set forth the net annual value of all such property.

That in such valuation shall be included all lands, whether cultivated or waste; and no lands, whether cultivated or waste, shall be valued at less than one shilling per acre per annum.

That all lands and buildings, the property of Her Majesty, held or used by any person, not officially, or by virtue of his office, but for his own profit or advantage, shall be included in such valuation; and any sheep, horses, or cattle, found upon any lands of the Crown, which are not so assessed, or for which no rates are paid, may be seized and impounded by any Commissioner of Crown Lands.

That the Directors, or any person appointed by them, in that behalf, may enter upon any land for the purpose of making such valuation, giving three days' notice, in certain cases, and doing as little damage as may be, and, if required, making reasonable satisfaction to the owner or occupier for any damage done.

That so soon as such valuation shall be made, it shall be lawful for the Directors to determine the rates to be levied in their respective districts, and to order and direct the levy of the same; provided no such rate shall exceed sixpence in the pound on the valuation above mentioned, and no greater number than four rates shall be levied in any one year.

That for every such rate of sixpence in the pound, the Directors may levy a corresponding rate of ten shillings for every male convict assigned to the parties so rated; but in all cases wherein convicts have been assigned on landed qualifications, such rates shall be levied in the district where those qualifications shall be, and not in the district where such convict servants may happen to be employed.

That all monies, which shall be collected under the proposed Bill, and paid into the hands of the Treasurer, shall form a fund for the benefit of the

That the monies so to be levied in each district, shall be paid by the respective tenants or occupiers of lands within the same, or by the proprietors, if there be no tenants, to the Collectors appointed by the Directors; and such Collectors shall pay over the same to the Treasurer of the district; and if any such tenant or occupier, or proprietor, shall neglect or refuse to pay such rates, the same may be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the party so in default.

MAIDENS' ROCKS LIGHT-HOUSES, NORTH-EAST COAST OF IRELAND.

Ballast Office, Dublin, September 9, 1841.

The Corporation for preserving and improving the Port of Dublin, hereby give notice, that an alteration is now in progress of being made in the appearance of the Towers of the Maidens' Rocks Light-Houses, which, on and from the 1st of November next, will be marked with broad belts or zones.

Specification given of the appearance of the Towers, by Mr. Halpin, the Inspector of Lighthouses.

Those towers have been hitherto coloured white; the lower spaces will be still continued white—the central belts, red—and, above these, white to the projecting galleries.

The red belts or zones will be nearly one-third of the heights of the towers from their bases to the outside galleries; the belt being 18 feet in height on the North Light-house; the belt being 19 feet in height on the South Light-house.

Note.—No change will take place in the appearance of the lights.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Harbour Master's Office, Auckland, 5th March, 1842.

BETWEEN Mutu Tapu and Waiheke Islands, and on either side of Mutu Hea, there is a good passage with deep water; care must, however, be taken not to approach too near to the N. W. end of Mutu Hea, from whence a reef runs out about a quarter of a mile.

In working along the south side of the Island of Rangitoto, the lead should be kept going, and vessels should not shoal less than three and a

There is no passage between Mutu Korea and the Eastern Head of the Tamaki River, for any but very small craft.

Along the south side of Waiheke there is a good passage in from four to six fathoms water; the opposite shore is shoal, and in standing towards it, the lead should be carefully attended to.

Between the eastern side of the Waiheke and the Islands Paroa, Te Roteroa, and Pa Ratu, there is a good passage, with deep water; vessels should keep nearest Waiheke shore, and not approach the Islands under six fathoms to avoid some rocky patches near them. Care should also be taken to avoid a small sand bank under water, lying about a mile off the Waiheke shore near the southern entrance of the passage, and almost abreast of a settlement occupied by Mr. Graham.

Between Paroa and Pakia Islands there is not a good passage, but small vessels, with a leading wind, may pass through by keeping very close to the Paroa shore in three and four fathoms, to avoid a Gravel Spit, which stretches from the north end of Pakia in a N. N. E. direction nearly across the passage.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD;

oR,

A FREE PARDON AND PASSAGE TO ENGLAND.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 23rd of February last, a party of six or more Europeans surprised a number of Aboriginal natives, sleeping in a tea-tree scrub, in the immediate vicinity of the station of Messrs. Smith & Osbrey, in the Portland Bay District, and then and there barbarously murdered three Aboriginal females and one male child, by gun or pistol shots, besides wounding a fourth female; - His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that a Reward of One Hundred Pounds will be paid to any Free person or persons (except the actual perpetrator) who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the parties guilty of the above crime; and if the party giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Free Pardon and a Passage to England to such Prisoner of the Crown.
