**ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD ;**

**A FREE PARDON AND PASSAGE TO ENGLAND.**

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 23rd of February last, a party of six or more Europeans surprised a number of Aboriginal natives, sleeping in a tea-tree scrub, in the immediate vicinity of the station of Messrs. Smith & Osbrey, in the Portland Bay District, and then and there barbarously murdered three Aboriginal females and one male child, by gun or pistol shots, besides wounding a fourth female;—His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that a Reward of One Hundred Pounds will be paid to any Free person or persons (except the actual perpetrator) who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the parties guilty of the above crime; and if the party giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Free Pardon and a Passage to England to such Prisoner of the Crown.
