An Act to further continue for a limited time, an Act, intituled "An Act for regulating the constitution of Juries, and for the trial of Issues in certain cases, in the Supreme Court of New South Wales."

WHEREAS an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales was passed in the Second year of the Reign of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, intituled "*An Act for regulating the constitution of Juries, and for the Trial of Issues in certain cases, in the Supreme Court of New South Wales,*" which said Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the Fourth year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled "*An Act to continue for a limited time, an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, intituled 'An Act for regulating the constitution of Juries, and for the Trial of Issues in certain cases, in the Supreme Court of New South Wales,' and to make further provision for Trial by Jury in Criminal cases, in the said Colony,*" continued until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-five; and whereas the said first recited Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the Fifth year of the Reign of His said Majesty, further continued until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six; and whereas the said first recited Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the Sixth year of the Reign of His said Majesty, further continued until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven; and whereas the said first recited Act was, by a certain other Act of the said

Governor and Council, passed in the Seventh year of the Reign of His said Majesty, further continued until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight; and whereas the said first recited Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the First year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, further continued until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and forty; and whereas the said first recited Act was, by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the Third year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, further continued until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and forty-two; and whereas it is expedient further to continue the said first recited Act as hereinafter provided: Be it therefore enacted, by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, That the said first recited Act, passed in the Second year of the Reign of His said Majesty, as altered and amended by any of the Acts herein recited, shall be, and the same is hereby continued in force for two years from and after the said thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

(Act may be altered or amended during the Session.)

II. And be it enacted, That this Act may be altered and amended by any Act to be passed during the present Session of the Legislative Council.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in the Act of Uniformity, which establishes the Liturgy of the Church of England, provision is made for such alterations in the Prayers for the Royal Family as, from time to time, shall become necessary; it is, therefore, this day ordered, by Her Majesty in Council, that in the Morning and Evening Prayers, in the Litany, and in all other parts of the Public Service, as well in the Occasional Offices as in the Book of Common Prayer, where the Royal Family is appointed to be particularly prayed for, the following form and order shall be observed, viz:—

Adelaide the Queen Dowager, the Prince Albert, Albert Prince of Wales, and all the Royal Family.

And Her Majesty doth strictly charge and command, that no edition of the Common Prayer be henceforth printed but in the form aforementioned; and that in the meantime, and until copies of such edition may be had, all Parsons, Vicars, and Curates within this Realm do, (for the preventing of mistakes) with the pen, correct and amend all such Prayers in their Church Books, according to the foregoing direction; and, for the better notice hereof, that this Order be forthwith printed and published, and sent to the several parishes; and that the Right Reverend the Bishops do take care that obedience be paid to the same accordingly.

THE Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners have been instructed, by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to issue the following notice:—

1. The latest official advices from New South Wales, on the subject of finance, having shewn reason to anticipate that, in consequence of the great extent of Emigration on Bounty last year, there will not be any disposable funds until a very advanced period of this year, and then only a very limited amount, Emigration to New South Wales, free of expense, will continue to be suspended until further notice.

2. The orders of the Colonial Government for bounty, conditional upon the existence of funds available for their discharge, are cancelled; since it has become apparent that no means could accrue to provide for them, within the time to which such orders are limited.

3. All other orders or authorities for bounty are to be produced at the Office of the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners, on or before the 1st of March next; but it is to be distinctly understood, that in calling for these orders, Her Majesty's Government does not pledge itself to any particular course respecting them, and only requires them to be produced, in order to ascertain the whole amount of permissions outstanding in this country for the introduction of emigrants, and to be the better enabled to determine what measures may hereafter become proper on the subject.
