PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.
WHEREAS in the Act of Uniformity, which establishes the Liturgy of the Church of England, provision is made for such alterations in the Prayers for the Royal Family as, from time to time, shall become necessary; it is, therefore, this day ordered, by Her Majesty in Council, that in the Morning and Evening Prayers, in the Litany, and in all other parts of the Public Service as well in the Occasional Offices as in the Book of Common Prayer, where the Royal Family is appointed to be particularly prayed for, the following form and order shall be observed, viz:—

Adelaide the Queen Dowager, the Prince Albert, Albert Prince of Wales, and all the Royal Family.

And Her Majesty doth strictly charge and command, that no edition of the Common Prayer be henceforth printed but in the form aforementioned; and that in the meantime, and until copies of such edition may be had, all Parsons, Vicars, and Curates within this Realm do, (for the preventing of mistakes) with the pen, correct and amend all such Prayers in their Church Books, according to the foregoing direction: and, for the better notice hereof, that this Order be forthwith printed and published, and sent to the several parishes; and that the Right Reverend the Bishops do take care that obedience be paid to the same accordingly.

No. 1.—*A Bill to facilitate proceedings against the proprietors of a certain Company, who have occupied land in New South Wales, for the purpose of the sale of the same, and for other purposes therein contained.*

That the Act shall have effect from the passing thereof, and shall continue in force for two years after the expiration of the said term, and until the end of the next Session of the Legislature, and until the winding up of the said Company.

Wales, on the subject of finance, having shewn reason to anticipate that, in consequence of the great extent of Emigration on Bonny last year, there will not be any disposable funds until a very advanced period of this year, and then only a very limited amount, Emigration to New South Wales, free of expense, will continue to be suspended until further notice.

2. The orders of the Colonial Government for bounty, conditional upon the existence of funds available for their discharge, are cancelled; since it has become apparent that no means could accrue to provide for them, within the time to which such orders are limited.

3. All other orders or authorities for bounty are to be produced to the Office of the Colonial Land and Emigration Commissioners, on or before the 1st of March next; but it is to be distinctly understood, that a calling for these orders, Her Majesty's Government does not pledge itself to any particular course respecting them, and only requires them to be produced, in order to ascertain the whole amount of permissions outstanding in this country for the introduction of emigrants, and to be the better enabled to determine what measures may hereafter become proper on the subject.
