No. 1.—“ *A Bill to amend an Act, intituled ‘ An Act for the better preservation of the Ports, Harbours, Havens, Roadsteads, Channels, Navigable Creeks and Rivers, in New South Wales, and the better regulation of Shipping in the same.’ ”*

With reference to the penalty of £100, imposed by the fifth clause of the Act 4 Victoria, No. IV., on any Master of a Vessel who shall allow any passenger to embark on board his Vessel, whose name is not contained in the outward list of Crew and Passengers, required to be delivered to the Officers of Customs before the departure of Vessels—

It is proposed to empower the Judge, before whom any such case shall be heard, to reduce such penalty to any sum not less than £10, if he think fit.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD,
OR,
A FREE PARDON AND PASSAGE TO
ENGLAND.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 23rd February last, a party of six or more Europeans, surprised a number of Aboriginal Natives sleeping in a Tea-tree scrub, in the immediate vicinity of the station of Messrs. Smith and Osbrey, in the Portland Bay district, and then and there barbarously murdered three Aboriginal females and one male child, by Gun or Pistol shots, besides wounding a fourth female; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of One Hundred Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons (except the actual perpetrators) who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the parties guilty of the above crime; and if the party giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Free Pardon and passage to England to such prisoner of the Crown.

POLICE DISTRICTS.

An error having occurred in the descriptions of the Police Districts of Bathurst and Hartley, as published on the 17th September, 1841; His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct, that amended descriptions of these Districts be published for general information.

15. HARTLEY.

Embracing the western portion of the county of Cook, the midland and southern portions of the county of Westmoreland, and a north-eastern portion of the county of Georgiana; bounded on the north by the valley of the Colo River, from the confluence of Wollim Creek to the confluence of Cook's Creek; on the west by Cook's Creek and the dividing range to the source of Solitary Creek, at Honeysuckle Hill, where the county boundary meets the Bathurst Road, thence by Solitary Creek to its confluence with Fish River, and by the Fish River to its source, thence by a line bearing south-westerly, crossing the dividing range to the source of the Isabella River, and by that River to its confluence with the Abercrombie; on the south by the Abercrombie River to its southern source, from thence by a line bearing

south-westerly to Burrah Burrah Lake, thence to the source of Guinecor Creek, and by this Creek to its confluence with the Wollondilly; on the east by the Wollondilly to Bonnum Peak, intersected by a line from Jellore Mountain to Colong Mountain, bearing north-westerly, thence by this line to the middle source of the Koroming River, thence by the Koroming River and Jamison's Valley to the Weatherboard Hut, thence by a line bearing north-westerly to King George's Mount, thence by a line bearing northerly to the source of the Wollongabby, and by this River and the Colo River to the confluence of the Wollim Creek aforesaid.

16. BATHURST.

Embracing the county of Roxburgh, the northern portion of the county of Bathurst, the northern portion of the county of Georgiana, and the western portion of the county of Westmoreland; bounded on the north by the Cudgegong River to the Village Reserve; on the west by a creek, bearing south-westerly to the western source of Cunningham's Creek, thence by Cunningham's Creek, the Turin River, and Macquarie River to Lewis' Ponds, thence by Lewis' Ponds and Frederick's Valley to the northern boundary of Simeon Lord's grant, and from thence by a line bearing south-westerly to Conobalas; on the south by a line from Conobalas, bearing easterly to the north-east angle of J. Stirling's grant, and to the dividing range dividing the waters of King's Plains and Fitzgerald's Valley, and by the crest of this range and the dividing range of the Abercrombie and Campbell's Waters to the Werong range, at the source of the Fish River; on the east by the Fish River to its confluence with Solitary Creek, and by that Creek to its source at Honeysuckle Hill, the point where the county boundary meets the road, thence by the great dividing range to the source of Cook's Creek, and by this creek to its confluence with the Colo River, and by this river to its source and the source of the Cudgegong River aforesaid.
