**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by a certain Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the Second Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns, respectively, and for the removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein,*" it was amongst other things enacted, That whenever the Governor, or Acting Governor for the time being, should deem it expedient to extend the same to any other Town in the said Colony, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor, or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, the GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, by this my Proclamation, do hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act be extended to Newtown, in the District of Port Phillip.

**RULES and ORDERS** for carrying into effect the Act for giving Relief to Insolvent Persons, and providing for the due collection, administration, and distribution of Insolvent Estates, within the Colony of New South Wales.

**TUESDAY**, the Fourth day of January, in the Year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

1. One of the Judges will sit at Ten o'clock, on every Wednesday, during Vacation, and on every Thursday, during Term, for the hearing and determination of all matters committed to the Court by the Insolvent Act; and all such matters may also be brought before the Court on any Banco Day.

2. All applications under the Act, to a Judge of the Court, shall be made to the Judge attending in Chambers, in the same manner as other Chamber Business of the Court, except that when in other cases summonses for parties to attend is required to be signed by the Chief Clerk it shall in Insolvent Estates proceedings be issued and signed by the Chief Commissioner of Insolvent Estates.

3. The Chief Commissioner, resident at Sydney, shall have the same notice of intended applications to the Court or Judge, in matters relating to his office or duties, as is required to be given by any practice or rule of Court, to parties interested in or intended to be affected by any application; and where upon any such application a reference may be required to be made to any of the proceedings in any Insolvent Estate, he shall also have notice thereof.

4. The Chief Commissioner shall attend the Court upon all sittings for the dispatch of business

relating to Insolvent Estates, and shall minute and read all proceedings, orders, and judgments of the Court thereon, and (when required) shall have ready for reference the proceedings under his charge in any Estate.

5. The Chief Commissioner shall, personally or in case of his unavoidable absence, by some proper person authorised by him, make all applications and reports to the Court or Judge, required by the Act to be made by the said Commissioner, or by the Trustees of any Insolvent Estate; provided that where any such application shall require argument by Counsel, then the Commissioner may direct the Trustees to undertake the same; but in no other case shall costs of Attorney or Counsel be charged against any Insolvent Estate, unless specially allowed by the Court or a Judge.

6. All process of this Court necessary to be issued for procuring the attendance of any person before the Court, or any Judge or Commissioner in matters relating to Insolvent Estates, shall be issued and signed by the Chief Commissioner.

7. All Petitions, Schedules, Reports, and Proceedings in Insolvent Estates, shall be written or printed bookwise, on paper of the ordinary foolscap size, with two inches vacant space on the left hand side, and not less than one inch at the top and bottom, and the Chief Commissioner shall keep and preserve the proceedings in every Estate when completed, separately numbered and endorsed for reference, and covered.

8. Any person summoned to show cause why his Estate should not be adjudged to be sequestrated, shall, within four days after being so summoned deliver to the Chief Commissioner, where the residence of such person is within twenty-five miles of such Commissioner's residence, and where it is at a greater distance, then shall within the said time put into the nearest Post Office, addressed to such Commissioner, a statement in writing, signed by him, of any facts alleged in the summons which he intends to dispute, and the said Commissioner shall file the same with the proceedings in the case, and such statement shall stand as or in lieu of a plea in denial of the facts disputed.

9. All facts, no notice of an intention to dispute which shall have been so given, shall, upon the hearing of the case, be taken to be admitted by the person so summoned, and the petitioning Creditor shall not be required to prove the same.

10. The proceedings upon the hearing of any such case shall be, as near as may be, the same as upon any ordinary trial.

11. The Chief and other Commissioners of Insolvent Estates, Messengers, and Officers employed by them, shall be entitled to receive the fees in the Schedule hereunto annexed, for the several matters specified, and each Commissioner shall, four times in every year, viz., on the 1st of January, 1st of April, 1st of July, and 1st of October, report to the Court, the amount of fees payable to them, and to the several Messengers and Officers employed under them during the previous quarter.

12. The Chief Commissioner shall also report to the Court, yearly, on the 1st of January, or so soon after as a Court shall be holden for the purposes of this Act, the amount of Government Fees, and Auction and other Duties, Post Office Charges, and Advertisements in the *Government Gazette*, which shall have been paid during the

preceding year, respecting Insolvent Estates, so far as the same can be ascertained.

13. A Schedule of all Fees receivable under the Act shall be hung up in a conspicuous place, in the Office of the Chief, and every other Commissioner of Insolvent Estates.

**CONDITIONS.**

**QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.**

1. All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.
2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean, sound Colonial Wheat, Barley and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent., and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent., has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of 3lbs, and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs, each, and baked 24 hours before being issued.

3.
