T Twelve o'clock on THURSDAY, the A 22nd day of December next, the Colonial Treasurer will put up to Auction, at the Colonial Treasury, Bent-street, Sydney, the Leases for one year, commencing the 1st day of January, 1843, of the Tolls and Dues authorised and imposed by the Act of the Governor and Council, 4th William IV., No. 16, arising and to be collected at the undermentioned Toll Gates and Ferries, viz :-
