PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a certain Act of the GOVERNOR and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "*An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws for the Transportation of Offenders in New South Wales, and for defining the respective powers and authorities of General Quarter Sessions, and of Petty Sessions, and for determining the places at which the same shall be holden, and for better regulating the Summary Jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace, and for repealing certain Laws and Ordinances relating thereto*," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions for the said Colony should be holden at such times, respectively, as the Governor, for the time being, should, by any Proclamation, duly issued for such purpose, appoint:—Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that the said Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden, during the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, at the several times and places hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

At SYDNEY, on Monday, the 5th of February, the 29th of April, the 29th of July, and the 28th of October; and also by adjournments of such Sessions, respectively, on Tuesday, the 12th of March, the 11th of June, the 10th of September, and the 10th of December.

At PARRAMATTA, on Tuesday, the 2nd of January, the 2nd of April, the 2nd of July, and the 1st of October.

At BERRIMA, on Thursday, the 29th of February,

the 6th of June, the 29th of August, and the 5th of December.

At MAITLAND, on Monday, the 8th of January, the 8th of April, the 8th of July, and the 7th of October.

At BATHURST, on Thursday, the 21st of March, the 20th of June, the 19th of September, and the 19th of December.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this 21st day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and in the seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

THE following Address was presented to His Excellency the GOVERNOR, by the District Council of Windsor:—

To His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, &c., &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY—

WE, the Warden and undersigned Members of the Windsor District Council, in Council assembled, most respectfully beg leave to approach and to tender our grateful thanks to your Excellency for having, with the utmost readiness and cordiality, complied with an Address from the Honorable the Legislative Council, embodying a Resolution that, "In the present state of the Colony, it is highly inexpedient, if not impossible, to cast any portion of the Police Expenses on the Country Districts, for the year 1844;" and that, by your Message to the Honorable the Legislative Council, a copy of which has been forwarded to the Warden of this District, in a letter from the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, informing him of your Excellency's consent to the defraying, from the Public Revenue, the

necessary expenditure for Police in Country Districts during the year 1844.

We would also take this opportunity of expressing our deep sense of gratitude to your Excellency for having extended your liberal consideration towards the support of the School Establishment for this District, in common with others, in ordering that the necessary expenditure should be defrayed out of the General Revenue for the year 1844.

And we cannot leave this subject without again tendering to your Excellency our most grateful thanks for the paternal solicitude which your Excellency has manifested at a time when the pecuniary distresses of this once flourishing Agricultural District are so deeply felt by all classes.

JOHN TEMPLETON, BY THE SHIP
"BAROSSA."

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has intimated, in a Despatch, dated 28th May, 1843, No. 79, that John Templeton, who was convicted at Edinburgh, in January, 1838, and sent to New South Wales, in the ship "Barossa," was sentenced to seven, and not to fourteen years transportation, as erroneously stated in the Indent.

DESCRIPTION.

John Templeton, per "Barossa;" year of arrival, 1839; native place, Edinburgh; trade or calling, tailor; age, 27 years; height, 5 feet 2 inches; complexion, ruddy; hair, brown; eyes, hazel.

Was assigned to Major Fraser, of Broulee, on 24th April, 1841, whose residence, or that of the prisoner, is not at present known.

TO BE PUT UP IN SEPARATE LOTS.

Each Lessee, with two responsible sureties, must enter into a Bond and Warrant of Attorney, securing regular payment of the rent by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, and containing an engagement binding him to a due observance of the conditions.

The attention of intending bidders is particularly directed to the following article of the conditions of sale, the requirements of which will be, in future, strictly enforced, viz. :—

" That the Lessees shall be bound, within one month from the commencement of their respective Leases, to put into good plight, state, and condition, as to the repairs thereof, the Turnpike Gate or Ferry respectively leased to them, and all Houses, Erections, and Buildings, and as respects the said Ferries, including also all Punts, Boats, Chains, Ropes, and Appurtenances thereunto belonging, and to keep the same in the like state of repair during the whole term or period which the said Leases shall respectively endure; and at the end or sooner determination of the said term, shall surrender and yield up the Gates, Ferries, Buildings, Vessels, and Appurtenances, in a good plight, state, and condition, as to the repairs thereof; and if any one or more of the said Lessees shall fail so to do, the Lessee or Lessees so failing shall pay, along with his or their last month's Rents, such a sum or sums as shall be requisite to effect the repairs required, to be determined by the report of the Colonial Architect, or any other qualified person appointed to inspect the same under the authority of the Governor, which sum shall become and be a part of the Rent agreed to be paid for the said Toll or Ferry respectively; and shall be recoverable, in like manner, by distress and sale of the defaulter's goods and chattels, under a warrant to be issued by

"the said Colonial Treasurer, or the Colonial Treasurer of the Colony for the time being."

TO PERSONS IN THE COUNTRY REQUIRING LABOUR.

BY direction of His Excellency the GOVERNOR, Notice is hereby given, that a number of married Labourers and others, resident in Sydney,

being no longer able to obtain employment there, it is the intention of the Government to afford, to such of them at least as have large families, and are willing to go into the Country, the means of proceeding into certain Districts, wherein it may be probable that their services would be gladly received.

Persons in the interior requiring labour, and not objecting to take men with families of young children, are therefore requested to communicate to the Police Magistrate, or to the Bench of Magistrates, (as the case may be) the description of labour required by them, and the rate of wages and rations which they would be willing to give according to the number of the family engaged.

To such communications every attention will be paid by the Government, consistently with a due regard to economy in the expenditure of the amount placed at its disposal for the purpose.

The operations of the Government will be materially assisted, if persons, sending wool drays to Sydney, will have the goodness to allow the use of them, on their return, for the conveyance of families into the inland Districts, and will communicate to the Police Magistrate, or Bench of the District, and to the Agent for Immigration, in Sydney, the probable date on which the drays will leave Sydney. Letters to the Agent for Immigration to be addressed, under cover, to the Clerk of the Executive Council.
