SUPREME COURT, PORT PHILLIP.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 4th Victoria, No. 22, intituled "*An Act for the more effectual administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies,*" the following Rule and Order of the Supreme Court, for the District of Port Phillip, has been transmitted to His Excellency by His Honor the Resident Judge, through His Honor the Superintendent, and will be forwarded as soon as conveniently may be, to the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, for Her Majesty's approval or disallowance thereof.

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales, for the District of Port Phillip.

It is ordered, from and after the first day of March next, that every declaration which shall be filed in the Office of this Court, where the cause of action is local in its nature, the venue shall be stated in the margin thereof, as follows, viz:—

TOWN OF MELBOURNE shall be a sufficient venue, if the cause of action shall arise within the Township of Melbourne.

COUNTY OF BOURKE shall be a sufficient venue, if the cause of action shall arise out of the Township of Melbourne, and within the County of Bourke.

AND DISTRICT OF PORT PHILLIP shall be a sufficient venue, if the cause of action shall arise at any place out of the County of Bourke.
