THE following Address, from the Members of the Legislative Council, was presented to His Excellency the GOVERNOR, at Government House, on Tuesday last, the 28th instant:—

To His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:—

After the close of the recent Session, conceiving that the Legislative Council, in its deliberative capacity, had virtually ceased to exist, we, the undersigned, who had been Members of the same under the Presidency of Your Excellency, felt one common anxiety to express the sentiments to which that connexion had given rise. But the almost immediate departure of Your Excellency for Norfolk Island, compelled us at that time to forego our purpose, and to await a more favorable opportunity.

That opportunity has at length presented itself, and in now carrying our original intention into effect, we have the additional gratification of congratulating Your Excellency on your safe return from that expedition, and of bidding you welcome to the seat of your Government.

We are anxious, principally, by the present address, to record our testimony, that the harmony between Your Excellency and the Council, which so happily characterized its debates and proceedings under your administration, has continued, without interruption, to their close.

We are sensible that the publicity given to those proceedings, by the admission of strangers during the sittings of the Council, while it tended to increase the public confidence in that body, and the benefit, at the same time, of its services to the Colony, could not be carried into effect without some risk of exposing the Government to difficulties, should any disagreement arise between the Executive and the Legislative authorities. We therefore derive peculiar satisfaction from the complete success of a measure, for which the Colony is principally indebted to the judgment and decision of Your Excellency.

We are not now to speak of the course of Legislation which has been pursued, nor of particular Acts upon which our decision has been already pronounced. But we should be wanting to the claims of equity, and to our own feelings, if we did not testify our high sense of the unwearied diligence and the distinguished ability with which Your Excellency has uniformly sustained the office of President of the Council. The voice of the public, we are persuaded, will confirm our declaration, that the powers of Your Excellency's mind have never failed to prove themselves equal to the demands which were made upon them; and their exercise has, on numerous occasions, given us cause to congratulate ourselves on the distinction reflected upon the Council at large, by the remarkable talent with which its proceedings were directed.

After the expressions of these sentiments to which we have given utterance without a dissentient voice, it remains for us only to thank Your Excellency for the estimate which you have formed, and have been pleased publicly to express, of our disposition to promote the general welfare. In attempting this, we have been indeed fortunate in having acted under the encouraging influence of Your Excellency's example.

The above address having been read by the Lord Bishop of Australia, (in the absence of the Chief Justice, now engaged on the Bathurst Circuit,) His Excellency was pleased to return to it the following answer:—

MY LORD AND GENTLEMEN,

I am truly obliged to you for this address; I cannot but highly estimate the kind feelings which have prompted it, or receive it without acknowledging the gratification which it affords me.

That a good understanding has happily prevailed amongst us, and continued without interruption to the end of our labours, is, indeed, owing to the publicity of our proceedings, well known to the whole

Colony; but an authentic record of the gratifying fact will be preserved by this Address; and I cannot but sincerely thank you for having given the stamp of your authority to recollections which are so grateful to me.

The harmony which has, during the period of five years, so uniformly existed amongst us, could not, however, have been maintained, had there not been invariably manifested on your part, sentiments of moderation and good will, and all other considerations been merged by you, in the single one of the public good.

It is most satisfactory to me to know, that the measure adopted in 1836, of opening our debates to the public, has been productive of no inconveniences, whilst it increased the confidence of the public in our body, and may have had the effect of providing precedents, from which our successors may derive benefit.

I am much obliged to you for your congratulations on my return from Norfolk Island, and for the welcome with which you have received me at the seat of Government.

The tie which united us for a particular purpose is indeed severed; but we still nevertheless stand to each other in the relation of persons having in view one common object; and we shall, gentlemen, I am convinced, all and each of us, continue in our several vocations, to labour for the benefit of the people of this land.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such Courts in the County of Cumberland,*" it was amongst other things enacted, that from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose, from time to time appoint: Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Requests shall be holden during the present year, at the times and places, and for the districts hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

At the CITY OF SYDNEY, for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the 15th day of September, 1841, and published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*, on Monday, the 8th day of May; Tuesday, the 6th day of June; Monday, the 3rd day of July; Monday, the 7th day of August; Monday, the 4th day of September; Monday, the 2nd day of

October; Monday, the 6th day of November; and Monday, the 4th day of December, and following days respectively.

At the TOWN of LIVERPOOL, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Thursday, the 20th of April; Wednesday, the 19th of July; and Wednesday, the 18th of October.

At the TOWN of CAMPBELLTOWN, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Friday, the 21st day of April; Thursday, the 20th day of July; and Thursday, the 19th day of October, and following days respectively.

At the TOWN of PARRAMATTA, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Monday, the 24th day of April; Monday, the 24th day of July; and Monday, the 23rd day of October, and following days respectively.

At the TOWN of WINDSOR, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Thursday, the 27th day of April; Wednesday, the 26th day of July; and Wednesday, the 25th day of October, and following days respectively.

At the TOWN of PENRITH, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, on Monday, the 19th day of June; Tuesday, the 19th day of September; and Tuesday, the 19th day of December, and following days respectively.
