PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies*;" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at 11 o'clock of Wednesday, the 14th day of June next, the following Suburban Allotments of Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act, being in addition to the suburban lots notified in my Proclamation of the 10th of April last, for sale on the same day. PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, issued in pursuance of an Act of the Governor of New South Wales with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, passed in the second year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act further to restrain the unauthorised occupation of Crown Lands, and to provide the means of defraying the expense of a Border Police*," the Crown Lands of the said Territory, adjacent to, and beyond the limits allotted for location, were divided into nine districts, one of which, numbered two, and designated the New England District, was described as "bounded on the east by a line north by compass from the top of Werrikimbee Mountain, which is at the head of the Hastings River; on the south by a line west by compass from the top of Werrikimbee to the great dividing Range; on the west by the western extreme of the great dividing Range, so as to include the Table Land; and on

the north the boundary is indefinite :” And whereas it is found expedient to divide the same, now therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in virtue of the authority in me vested by the above recited Act, do hereby proclaim that the said District has been divided into Two Districts, and that the following are the boundaries of the same respectively, namely,—

NEW ENGLAND DISTRICT—Bounded on the east by a line from the confluence of the Barnard and Manning Rivers, to the top of Mount Sea View; thence by a line to the top of Werrikimbee Mount, and thence by a line north by compass from Werrikimbee, dividing this from the County of Macquarie, and from the M’Leay and Clarence River Districts; on the north by a line due west, so as to intersect the top of Mount Girard, near the head of the north branch of the Clarence, and dividing this from the Darling Downs District; on the west by the western extreme of the great dividing range, so as to include the Table Land; and on the south by the Manning River, which forms the north boundary of the County of Gloucester.

DARLING DOWNS DISTRICT—Bounded on the south by a line extending due west, so as to intersect the top of Mount Girard, which is near the head of the north branch of the Clarence River, and dividing this from the New England District; on the east by the range dividing the eastern and western waters, separating this from the Clarence River District and from the County of Stanley; and on the north and west the boundaries are indefinite.

And whereas it has become necessary to make certain alterations in the boundaries of a certain other District, known as the M’Leay River District, as set forth in my Proclamation, bearing date the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in order to make them conform to the boundaries of the New England District, as hereinbefore set forth, I do therefore hereby further Proclaim, that the following are the boundaries of the same, that is to say,

M’LEAY RIVER DISTRICT—Bounded on the west by a line from Mount Sea View to the top of Werrikimbee Mount, and thence by a line north by compass from Werrikimbee, dividing this from the New England District; on the south-east and south by the County of Macquarie, being a line from Mount Sea View to Kippara, and thence to the mouth of the M’Leay River; on the east by the sea coast; and on the north by the ranges which form the basin of the Clarence on the south side of that river.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this eleventh day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and in the sixth year of Her Majesty’s Reign.
