WINDSOR.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the Colony, have been issued, bearing date the 24th instant, incorporating the Inhabitants of the District of Windsor, in the Counties of Cumberland, Cook, and Hunter, as hereunder described, to be and form a District, for the purposes of the Act of the Imperial Parliament, 5th and 6th Victoria, c. 76, intituled "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land,*" and also establishing, within the said District, a Council for the local Government thereof.

The Windsor Charter is precisely similar in its provisions to the Charter establishing the District Council of Maitland, as published in the supplementary *Government Gazette* of the 26th instant, and the following Gentlemen are nominated in the Charter to fill the Offices hereafter named respectively, viz. :—

The boundaries of the District, as prescribed by

the Charter, are as follow :—Embracing a north-western portion of the County of Cumberland, and the north-eastern portion of the County of Cook, and a southern portion of the County of Hunter; bounded on the north by the Hawkesbury to Wiseman's Ferry, thence up the valley of Webb's Creek, and by the dividing range to the confluence of the Wollim Creek with the Colo River; on the west by the Colo River and the Wollonganby to its two sources, thence by a line bearing south to King George's Mount, and from thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Grose's River; on the south by Grose's River to its confluence with the Hawkesbury, thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Rickaby's Creek, at the crossing of the Richmond Road, and by this road to Eastern Creek; on the east by Eastern Creek to its confluence with Breakfast Creek, thence by a line bearing east to the Windsor Road, and by this Road to its junction with the Pitt Town Road, from thence by a line bearing north-easterly to William Suttor's grant of 50 acres to the North Road, and by this road to the south-west angle of the parish of Frederick, thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the Hawkesbury aforesaid.

BATHURST, commencing at the north-east corner on the Macquarie River where the northern side of Hope-street joins that river; and bounded northerly by that side of Hope-street bearing south $41\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west to its intersection with the western side of Lambert-street; westerly by the western side of that street, being a line bearing south $48\frac{1}{2}$

degrees east to its intersection with the southern side of Seymour-street; and southerly by the southern side of Seymour-street, being a line bearing north $41\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east to Queen Charlotte's Ponds, and then by a line in the same bearing to the Macquarie River; and by that river downwards to the north-east corner as aforesaid.
