## PROPERTY AND INCOME TAX.

IS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct the publication of the following Circular Despatch, dated 19th December, 1842, from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, on the subject of the liability of persons residing in the Colonies to pay the Property Tax, in respect of that portion of their incomes which may be derived from English funds.

(CIRCULAR.)

Downing-street, 19th December, 1842.

Sir,

I have the honor to acquaint you, that the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury have drawn my attention to the liability of persons residing in the Colonies to pay the Property Tax, in respect of that portion of their incomes which may be derived from the funds of this Country, and at their Lordships' request, I have to convey to you the following instructions, on the subject for your own guidance.

All salaries and personal allowances and emoluments, and all pensions and superannuations, retired or compassionate allowances, paid from funds derived from the Revenues of Great Britain, whether provided by Special Parliamentary Grant or otherwise, are liable to this Tax, from the 5th of April last, at the rate of Seven pence in the Pound, except in cases in which the party can shew that his whole annual income does not amount to £150. It will, therefore, be your duty on all occasions to make the proper deductions accordingly, (retrospectively from the 5th of April last, when the deductions may not have already been made,) from the amount of the Bills which you may have occasion in future to draw on the Treasury, whether on your own account, or for the salaries or allowances of other parties; and I have to request you to convey an intimation to the same effect to any Officers or Functionaries, within your Government, who may be authorised to draw Bills on the Treasury for any such payments.

In cases where exemption may be claimed from the Tax, an affidavit must be taken by the party, and transmitted with the Bill, to the effect that his income, including that on account of which the Bill is drawn, is less than £150 per annum, and such affidavit must have reference to the whole income of the party from whatever source derived, for, although emoluments derived from Colonial Revenues or property are not taxable, unless the recipients reside in Great Britain, they must be taken into account in considering a claim to exemption from the Tax on income derived from this Country.

When Bills are drawn on account of expenses or disbursements to other parties, a statement of the proportion of the amount applicable to salaries and allowances must accompany them, and the proper deductions be made therefrom, unless the parties shall claim exemption, when their affidavits ought to accompany the Bills.

You will distinctly understand, and cause it to be made generally known within your Government, that on the presentation at the Treasury of any Bill, drawn for salary or other allowance, becoming due on or after the 31st March, 1843, upon which the Income Tax has not been deducted, or claimed for remission, in conformity with the foregoing direc-

N.B.—Persons resident abroad, in Ireland, or elsewhere out of Great Britain, are liable to the Tax on the particular amount they may receive from the Public Revenue, although such amount may be less than £150 a-year, if the income they derive from other sources of property, either abroad, in Ireland, or elsewhere out of Great Britain, shall, together with their public allowance, amount to or exceed £150 per annum.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Sydney, 21st August, 1843. TICKET OF LEAVE HOLDERS AND ASSIGNED SERVANTS.

THERE being reason to apprehend that many Prisoners of the Crown, Ticket of Leave Holders, as well as Assigned Servants, are at present in Sydney, contrary to Regulations; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs public notice to be given, that any Prisoner of the Crown, whether the Holder of a Ticket of Leave, or an Assigned Servant, who may, after the publication of this notice, be found in Sydney, contrary to Regulations, will be sent to Cockatoo Island.

His Excellency is also further pleased to direct, that all Passports or Passes for more than fourteen days, enabling Ticket of Leave Holders or Assigned Servants to visit Sydney shall cease to be in force, after the 1st September next, unless the Holder of such Pass shall immediately on his arrival in Sydney, present himself at the Office of the Principal Superintendent of Convicts, and procure a renewal of the same, it being however understood, that Passes will not be renewed as a matter of right, but only in cases which may seem to justify the indulgence.

No Fee will be charged on the renewal of the

Passes under this order.

His Excellency further desires the re-publication of the following Extract from the Assignment Regulations, viz. :-

Twenty-seventh article of Assignment Regulations, of 9th May, 1835.

#### Convicts who may not remain in Sydney.

" No Convict Assigned under these Regulations, " (those specially assignable in Towns excepted,) " shall be permitted to remain within the limits of "the Town of Sydney for more than one week at " any one time, or for more than three weeks in any " year, upon pain of such servants being withdrawn, " and the assignee considered incapable of receiving " Convict Servants in future."
