SUPREME COURT, PORT PHILLIP.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 4 Victoria, No. 22, intituled "*An Act for the more effectual Administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies,*" the following Rules and Orders of the Supreme Court for the District of Port Phillip have been transmitted to His Excellency by His Honor the Resident Judge, and will be forwarded, as soon as conveniently may be, to the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, for Her Majesty's approval or disallowance thereof.

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales, for the District of Port Phillip.

It is ordered, that the following General Rules do take effect and be in force from and after the respective dates thereof.—25th September, 1843.

(38th of the standing Rules repealed.)

1. That the 38th of the standing Rules of this Court, which said Rule is in the words following, that is to say,—“That together with any Summons, Writ, or Primary Process in any Action, an attested copy of the Declaration intended to be filed in such Action, duly examined, certified, and signed by the plaintiff's Attorney, shall be served with such process, which otherwise will be of no effect,” shall, from and after the date hereof, be repealed. [25th September, 1843.]

(Time allowed for settling Debt and Co ts.)

2. That the 40th of the standing Rules, regulating the Common Law Practice of this Court, be

repealed; and that defendants may pay the amount of debt and costs in all cases, on or before the last day allowed for appearance, without further charge than they would be subject to in case of payment within four days. [25th September, 1843.]

(Indorsement on Writs of Summons.)

3. That upon every Summons issued for recovery of any debt, and on every copy thereof served, there shall be an Indorsement stating truly the amount of such debt, and (when Interest is claimed) that the plaintiff seeks also to recover interest thereon; and that on payment thereof to the plaintiff or his Attorney, at any time before the day of

(being the time of appearance within limited) together with £3 3s. for costs, and mileage, at the rate of nine-pence per mile, from the place of service to the residence of the Sheriff's Deputy serving the same, further proceedings will be stayed; and such Indorsement shall immediately precede the Notice required to be endorsed on such Summons. [25th September, 1843.]

(Costs on Summons.)

4. That the said sum of £3 3s. shall include not only the costs of issuing and serving such Writ, (mileage excepted) and of returning the same, but of attending receiving debt and costs; Provided, that where an Alias Writ shall have become necessary, and shall have accordingly issued, the Attorney shall be entitled to £1 1s. extra. [25th September, 1843.]

(Not necessary to serve Notice of Declaration on defendant except where an Attorney is the defendant.)

5. That it shall not be necessary, in any Action, (except where an Attorney of this Court is the defendant) to serve a defendant with Notice that a Declaration has been filed. [30th September, 1843.]

(Defendant to give notice of appearance, and plaintiff, on receiving same, to deliver to defendant a copy of the Declaration or proceedings stayed.)

6. That in all cases where a defendant shall appear, or put in and perfect Bail, to any Action, he shall forthwith give notice thereof to the plaintiff or his Attorney, who shall thereupon deliver to the said defendant or his Attorney a true copy of such Declaration, and all further proceedings in such Action shall be stayed until such copy be delivered; and the said defendant shall have the like time for pleading after the delivery of such copy as he was entitled to at the time of serving such notice; (If notice not served, And if the defendant shall fail to give such notice as aforesaid, or to file his plea, the said plaintiff shall, at the expiration of the time allowed for pleading, be at liberty to compute his principal and interest, (if the Action is brought upon a Bill of Exchange or Promissory Note) or to set down his cause for assessment of damages by default, as the case may be, according to the course and practice of the Court. [30th September, 1843.]

(Declaration to be filed on or before the last day for appearance, or within eight days next following.)

7. That the 44th of the standing Rules, regulating the Common Law practice of this Court, be repealed, and that, in lieu thereof, the following be established, viz:—That, in every Action at Law, the plaintiff

shall, on or before the last of the days allowed for the defendant's appearance, or within eight days thence next ensuing, file, in the Office of the Supreme Court, a short Declaration, setting forth, in a simple and compendious manner, the plaintiff's true cause of Action, and particularly avoiding superfluous forms and unnecessary matter; and in all Actions of Trespass, *quare clausum fregit*, the said Declaration shall describe the place by its name or abutments, or by reference to a chart to be annexed thereto; and the Deputy Registrar, or other Officer shall mark, on the back of the same, the day on which it was filed, and likewise minute the same in the Action Book; (If not filed defendant may sign Judgment of non pros.) and in case such Declaration shall not be filed within the time hereby sign Judgment of non pros. [30th September, 1843.]

(Particulars to be furnished on demand, or proceedings stayed until delivery.)

8. That in all cases where the plaintiff shall declare generally, without specifying the particulars of his cause of Action, the defendant or his Attorney may demand, in writing, a particular of the said plaintiff's demand; and after such demand shall have been duly served upon the said plaintiff or his Attorney, all further proceedings in such Action shall be, and be deemed to be, stayed, until an explicit particular, in writing, specifying items, dates, and amounts, shall be delivered to the said defendant or his Attorney; and if the particulars delivered in pursuance of the above demand, shall not be sufficiently explicit, and an order shall afterwards be obtained for better particulars, the plaintiff shall pay the costs of such application—provided that, if the plaintiff or his Attorney shall fail to deliver such particular as aforesaid, within one month after the service of such demand, then the defendant may sign a Judgment of non pros, unless the Court or Judge thereof shall, upon sufficient cause being shewn upon Affidavit, allow further time for the delivery thereof. CONTRACTS FOR THE COLONIAL SERVICE, FOR 1844.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Tenders will be received at this Office until *Monday, the 6th November next, at noon*, for furnishing, for the Colonial Service, in the several Districts, the Supplies undermentioned, in such quantities as may be required, during Twelve Calendar Months, commencing 1st January, 1844, upon the conditions hereafter specified.

PROVISIONS.

1. The Ration for Emigrants—*For Men*: 24oz. wheaten bread, 16oz. fresh meat, 8oz. vegetables, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. of salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap.—*For Women*: 16oz. wheat bread, 12oz. fresh meat, 6oz. vegetables, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, $1\frac{3}{4}$ oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.—Children under ten years, to be allowed two-thirds of the Ration of Female Adults: above that age, and under fifteen, the same as Adults.

2. The Ration for Prisoners of the Crown, and others in the employment of Colonial Departments.

when authorised to receive it, with the exceptions specified in Nos. 3, 6, and 7—20oz. wheat bread, 8oz. maize meal, 16oz. fresh beef, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. salt, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap.

3. The Rations to Officers in charge of Surveying parties, when in the field, and men composing such parties; and for Soldiers of the Mounted Police, and other Mounted parties, when required:—24oz. flour, 16oz. fresh beef, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tobacco, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap.

4. The Ration for wives of Soldiers of the Mounted Police:—8oz. bread, 8oz. meat.

5. The Ration for children of Soldiers of Mounted Police, above 7 years:— $5\frac{3}{4}$ oz. of bread, $5\frac{3}{4}$ oz. meat, —under 7 years, 4oz. of bread, and 4oz. of meat.

6. The Ration to the Superintendent and Crew of the Floating-light Vessel, Sydney Harbour—16oz. biscuit, 8oz. flour, 16oz. fresh beef, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 3oz. sugar, $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz. raisins, 1-14 pint oatmeal, 1-14 pint vinegar.

7. The Ration to Men attending the Light-house, South Head, Telegraphs, and Boatmen in the Departments of Customs, Harbour Master, and Police—24oz. wheat bread, 16oz. fresh beef, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. salt, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap.

8. The Ration to Apprentices to the Government Printer, and Colonial Architect:—20oz. bread, 16oz. fresh beef or mutton, 8oz. vegetables, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, 2oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

9. To prisoners confined in Gaol—12oz. wheat bread, 12oz. maize meal, 4oz. fresh beef, 8oz. vegetables, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap—(Ration No. 2 is issued to Gaol attendants, and to Witnesses and others awaiting bail; and if confined in solitary cells, Ration No. 11.)

10. To children of Female Prisoners confined in Gaol—8oz. wheat bread, 4oz. fresh beef, 1 pint milk, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. yellow soap.

11. Prisoners confined in Lock-up or Watch-houses—24oz. wheat bread, or 20oz. flour—(Ration No. 2 is occasionally issued at Watch-houses, to Prisoners of the Crown, when travelling from one station to another, and in other cases when sanctioned by a Magistrate.)

12. Forage for Horses and Oxen—8lbs. maize or barley, or 10lbs. of oats, 4lbs. bran, 12lbs. oaten or cultivated grass hay, and 4lbs. wheat straw, for each horse daily, and half that quantity for each bullock.

13. For the Light-house, South Head, and Floating-light, Sydney Harbour—Best clarified sperm oil, per imperial gallon; patent wicks each.

14. Flour, tea, sugar, and tobacco, bread or meat, in such quantities as may be required, for deserving Mechanics and others, in the department of the Colonial Engineer, and other Colonial Establishments when authorised.

15. Fuel and Light—Firewood per 100lbs.; sperm oil, common oil, per imperial gallon; mould candles, dipt candles, cotton wick, per lb.

16. For Emigrants or other persons or Establishments in Sydney, when ordered—Fresh beef, fresh mutton, maize meal, the best wheat bread, read of 2nd and 3rd quality, ditto flour, arrow-root, sago, rice, tea, sugar, oatmeal, salt, yellow soap, pearl barley, tobacco, vegetables, per lb.; milk per quart; port wine per dozen; vinegar per imperial gallon; roach lime per bushel; straw for bedding per 100lbs.

17. For the Lunatic Asylum at Tarban Creek—Fresh beef, fresh mutton, wheat bread, bread of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quality, rice, tea, sugar, salt, per lb.; milk per quart; tobacco, soap, vegetables, per lb.; port wine per dozen; vinegar per gallon; sago, oatmeal, arrow-root, dipt candles, per lb.; common oil, per gallon; cotton wick, per lb.; forage, per ration; roach lime, per bushel; straw, per 100lbs.

MALE ORPHAN SCHOOL, LIVERPOOL.—Daily Ration.

1. To the Master, Schoolmaster, and Men employed as servants or labourers, and to every two of the Master's children—22oz. flour, 16oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. tea, 2oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

2. To the Wife of the Master and Female Servants entitled to Rations—16oz. flour, 12oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap.

3. Children above six years of age—On Holidays, 20oz. flour, 12oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, $1\frac{1}{4}$ oz. raisins or currants, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap. On Thursdays, 16oz. flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, $1\frac{1}{4}$ oz. raisins or currants, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap. On other days, 16oz. flour, 12oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap.

4. Nursery Children under six years of age—On Holidays, 16oz. flour, 4oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, 1oz. raisins or currants, 1oz. suet, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap. On Thursday, 12oz. flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, 1oz. raisins or currants, 1oz. suet, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap. On other days, 12oz. flour, 4oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap.

For Children under seven years of age, best wheaten bread is to be substituted, if required, in the proportion of 8oz. of bread for 12oz. of flour.

5. For the use of the Establishment—3 pints of oil.

6. For Artificers and Labourers— $\frac{3}{8}$ oz. of tobacco when authorised.

7. Forage for a Horse—10lbs. of maize.

8. Best wheat bread, flour, tea, sugar, salt, pearl barley, rice, oatmeal, arrowroot, sago, yeast, lard, candles, soap, vinegar, and straw, as required.

FEMALE ORPHAN SCHOOL, PARRAMATTA.—Daily Rations.

1. To the Superintendent, and men employed as labourers or servants, the same as No. 1 of the Male Orphan School.

2. To the Matron and Female Servants, entitled to Rations, the same as No. 2 of the Male Orphan School.

3. To each of the Female Orphans and Children—On Holidays, 16oz. flour, 8oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, $1\frac{1}{4}$ oz. raisins or currants, $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap. On Sundays, 12oz. flour, 8oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap. On other days, 12oz. flour, 8oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap.

For Children under seven years of age, best wheaten bread is to be substituted, if required, in the proportion of 8oz. of bread for 12oz. flour.

4. For the use of the Establishment— $1\frac{3}{4}$ pints of oil, $1\frac{1}{2}$ pints of vinegar.

5. For Artificers and Labourers—The same as No. 6 of the Male Orphan School.

6. Forage—The same as No. 7 of the Male Orphan School.

7. Best wheat bread, flour, tea, sugar, salt, pearl barley, sago, rice, oatmeal, arrowroot, yeast,

lard, candles, soap, vinegar, straw, and firewood, as required.

The Holidays at these Schools, are New Year's Day, Easter Day, Christmas Day, and the Queen's Birth Day.

When the full ration of flour, specified in No. 3, is not required, the Contractor is to deduct from his account the value of such quantity as may be undrawn or returned to him at the price per lb. fixed for that article, when supplied by him under No. 7.

INSTITUTION FOR DESTITUTE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHILDREN, SYDNEY.—Daily Rations.

1. To the Master, Schoolmaster, Storekeeper, and men employed as Servants—22oz. flour, 16oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. tea, 2oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

2. To the Matron and Female Servants—16oz. flour, 12oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap.

3. To the Male Children above six years of age—On Holidays, 20oz. flour, 12oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. raisins or currants, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap. On Thursdays, 16oz. flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. raisins or currants, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap. On other days, 16oz. flour, 12oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

4. To the Male Children under six years of age—On Holidays, 16oz. flour, 4oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, 1oz. raisins or currants, 1oz. suet, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap. On Thursdays, 12oz. flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, 1oz. raisins or currants, 1oz. suet, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap. On other days, 12oz. flour, 4oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap.

5. To the Female Children—On Holidays, 16oz. flour, 8oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. raisins or currants, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. suet, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap. On Sundays, 12oz. flour, 8oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap. On other days, 12oz. flour, 4oz. maize meal, 8oz. meat, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, 1oz. sugar, $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. soap.

For Children under seven years of age, best wheaten bread is to be substituted, if required, in the proportion of 8oz. of bread for 12oz. of flour.

DISTRICTS.

The Districts for which Contracts will be required are as follows, viz.:

1, Sydney; 2, Parramatta; 3, Liverpool; 4, Campbelltown; 5, Picton; 6, Camden & Narrellan; 7, Illawarra; 8, Berrima; 9, Goulburn; 10, Braidwood; 11, Broulee; 12, Queanbeyan; 13, Yass; 14, Windsor; 15, Penrith; 16, Hartley; 17, Bathurst; 18, Carcoar; 19, Wellington; 20, Mudgee; 21, Brisbane Water; 22, Newcastle and Raymond Terrace; 23, Dungog; 24, Maitland; 25, Wollombi & McDonald River; 26, Paterson; 27, Patrick's Plains; 28, Merton & Muswell Brook; 29, Scone and Murrurundi; 30, Cassilis; 31, Macquarie; 32, Clarence River; 33, Moreton Bay; 34, Monaroo; 35, Hume River.

The 31 Districts first mentioned are the Police Districts described in the Notices from this Office, dated 15th September, 1841, and 9th August, 1842, and further particulars respecting them may be obtained from the Police Magistrates and Benches.

Separate Tenders will be required for the forage, in the District of Sydney, and for the Institution for

destitute Roman Catholic Children; but the other supplies for that District are to be Tendered for together

The supplies for each of the other Districts, with the exception of those for the Orphan Schools and the Lunatic Asylum, are intended to be included in one Contract; and therefore no Tenders can be received, unless for supplying the whole that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender.

Separate Tenders must also be made for each of the Orphan Schools, and for the Lunatic Asylum.

The Tenders for the Moreton Bay District, to specify the sum required for the supply of the following articles, daily, for Boatmen, in addition to the price of their Ration No. 7, viz.:— $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea; 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar; $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tobacco.

CONDITIONS.

All the articles required by this Notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

The Flour and Bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, on the Ration of Emigrants, Surveying, and Mounted Police, or other parties, Superintendent and Crew of the Floating Light, Men at the Light House, Telegraphs, Boatmen, Apprentices, and the Orphan Schools, 20 per cent., and on the Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, 10 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

Beef and Mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required for the Ration to Emigrants, and, when the quantity admits of it, this, as well as the Convict Ration of Beef, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

Beef to be issued to the Orphan Schools on five days, and Mutton on two days of the week.

The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to the Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz.:—1lb wheat flour or 1lb biscuit, equal to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb of bread; 1lb salt beef, or 1lb mutton, or 10oz. salt pork, equal to 1lb of fresh beef. These substitutions are not, however, to be made, except on the requisition of the Officers authorized to draw the several Rations.

Hospital Bread is to be supplied to the Children of the Orphan Schools, and to the Institution for destitute Roman Catholic Children, when required by the Surgeon, in lieu of the ordinary Ration.

Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c. &c.

The supplies for Road and other parties are to be delivered at the nearest fixed Stations to the places where the party may be employed, on the requisition of the Officer in charge; and in case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, each of the species to be reckoned as the portion of the Ration undermentioned:—

The maize or barley 4-12, the hay 5-12, the bran 2-12, the straw 1-12.

The Supplies (not specified in the preceding paragraph) are to be delivered direct to the Parties or Establishments entitled thereto, on the written order of the person duly authorised for the purpose.

The Tenders for Provisions and Forage, when required by Rations, according to the scale under

their respective heads, are to express the price per Ration only.

The Tenders for Forage are not required to state the price of the Ration for Oxen, as when the latter is required, one-half of the allowance fixed for Horses will be drawn, and one-half the price allowed to the Contractor, whose engagement will be to provide for both Horses and Oxen.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the Government, according to the practice of the service. But in country districts, where such a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

If the board, arbitrators, or umpire, shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality—it being distinctly understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the mean time, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the Report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract.

It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made, or agreed to be made.

The Contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with

the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the Officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

Printed forms of Tender may be obtained at this Office, or from the Police Magistrates or Benches of the several Districts; and no Tender will be attended to unless accompanied by an agreement, in writing, signed by at least two solvent parties, stating their willingness to become sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract, and the bonds must be executed within ten days from the day of the acceptance of the Tender being notified, failing of which, the Contracts will be again advertised, another Tender accepted, or the supplies otherwise provided for.

The Tenders to contain the names of the Tenderers and their Sureties, and places of residence, at length.

Each Tender is to be enclosed in a separate envelope, and marked "*Tender for Provisions, &c.*"

As expedition is of so much importance, offers for any quicker conveyance of the Mails than is now effected will be favourably entertained; but it is to be understood that they are to be dispatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, either according to the present arrangement, or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the rate agreed upon. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The Contractors are to carry all bags and letters which may be delivered to them under

authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the Mails in carriages, and dry coverings for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet, by any of their servants, or passengers, or otherwise, to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under penalty of £5 for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five and ten minutes respectively.

A Mail Cart or Carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses, not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a penalty of £3 for each offence, on all roads except between Melbourne and Yass, and on that road the penalty will be £10.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails, are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed by him for that purpose.

The drivers and postmen are to be free men, and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Postmaster-General from the next quarterly instalment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering or an Agent for him, must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signatures of two respectable and solvent persons, willing to enter into a bond with the Contractor for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract.

The hours of starting from each Post Office, and other particulars, may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to Tender are invited to seek information.

FLINDERS LANE, MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Governor, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the sixth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act to incorporate the Inhabitants of the Town of Melbourne,*" it is, amongst other things, enacted, that the formation, repair, and ordering, of all public roads, lanes, streets, highways, and passages, and other public ways and places within the said Town, shall be wholly under the management and direction of the Town Council; and that the Surveyor or Surveyors, to be appointed by the said Council, shall have and enjoy all the powers, privileges, and immunities, which are had and enjoyed by the Surveyor General or his Deputy, acting under the provisions of an Act

passed in the second year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein," in which it is, amongst other things, enacted, that before the Surveyor General, or any person deputed by him, shall set out the footway in any street, or part of a street, or public place, in any of the said Towns, after the passing of the said Act, he shall lay before the Governor and Executive Council a plan of the same, setting forth the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Governor and Council, by notice in the New South Wales Government Gazette, to fix and declare the distance from the curb stone or exterior edge of the said footway in any such street, or part of a street or public place, within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building:—

And whereas the Surveyor of the Town of Melbourne has this day laid before the Governor and Executive Council a plan of the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways in the undermentioned Lane, and the Governor and Council have been pleased to approve the same:—Notice is hereby given, that the breadth of each of the footways in the said Lane shall be, and is hereby declared to be, four feet, and that it shall not be lawful for any person to erect any building within four feet of the curb stone or exterior edge of either of the said footways in the said Lane.
