PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR and Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Regulation of Gaols; " Prisons, and Houses of Correction, in the Co-"lony of New South Wales, and its Dependen-"cies, and for other purposes relating thereto," it is enacted, that all Buildings, Erections, Houses, and Premises, which should thereafter be crected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction within the said Colony and its. Dependencies, and which should, by Proclamation to be from time to time published in the New South Wales Government Gazette, by order of the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, be declared and notified as such public Gaols, Prisons, or Houses of Correction, should from and after the publication of such notification, be severally deemed and taken to be the public Gaol, Prison, or House' of Correction of the place or district where the same was or should be situated within the said Colony or its Dependencies respectively, and should be subject to the several provisions thereinafter made for the regulation, management, care and discipline of the public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction belonging to the said! Colony and its Dependencies, and of the prisoners confined within the same; and other prisoners for the same in the same is and the same there has been for the same time. whereas there has been for some time in course of exection, as and for a public Gaol, the building called and known by the name of the New Gaol, at-

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Melbourne, Port Phillip, in the said Colony; and it is expedient that the said Gaol should be and be declared to be a public Gaol, Prison, and House of Correction.—

Now therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue of the said recited Act; and in pursuance of the power and authority thereby in me vested, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify, the said building at Melbourne; to be a public Gaol, Prison, and House of Correction.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Goverment House, Sydney, this twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign:

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

A LL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury, are requested to furnish their accounts, through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers, in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively, up to that date, so that the entire revenue collected by each; may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received. The heads of departments and other officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect, in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

HE GOVERNOR has been pleased to rescind, the Regulations relative to Requisitions, dated 13th February, 1837, and to direct that the following he strictly attended to by the Civil Departments, the expenses of which are defrayed out of the Colonial Treasury :-

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1st .- All requisitions are to be made in duplicate, in the prescribed form, for the different Offices and Departments in Sydney, half-yearly, on the 1st of December, and 1st of June; and for all Out-stations, Port Phillip District included, annually, on the 1st of December, and unless in cases of great-urgency, at no other period, except for Clothing for prisoners in the Gaols, or employed in the Colonial Departments, for which Estimates and Requisitions must be made as heretofore, agreeable to the Regulations of 21st January, 1839. The Requisitions prepared under the former Regulation for the Quarter commencing this day, will, however, be received by the Colonial Storekeeper, but it will be necessary for the Departments in Sydney to forward to that Offi-cer, without delay, Supplementary Requisitons for the remainder of the half-year, and for those at the Out-stations similar démands for the remainder of the year.

2nd .- Applications for repair, or whitewashing of public Colonial buildings, and where land is attached, for the repair of gates, fences, and general maintenance of the premises in good order, and Requisitions for furniture for public Colonial buildings are to be made on the Colonial Architect.

3rd,-Requisitions for clothing, bedding, stationery, printed forms, and other description of store, are to be made on the Colonial Storekeeper.

4th .- Officers in charge of Departments are to include in their Requisitions, such articles only as are usually allowed, and absolutely necessary for the public service; to shew the date of last Requisition, the quantity in possession, and to give a correct description of the articles required, particularly as to size, weight, or measurement, when and yield up the Gates, Ferries, Buildings, Ves-

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necessary, and the service for which it is required, and to adhere as far as possible to the regulations in force on this head of Service.

5th.—Should stores, &c., or repairs to buildings' be urgently required, during any intermediate period, a Supplementary Requisition is to be sent in to the proper officer, accompanied by a report of the necessity.
