PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR and Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Regulation of Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction, in the Colony of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and for other purposes relating thereto," it is enacted, that all Buildings, Erections, Houses, and Premises, which should thereafter be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction within the said Colony and its Dependencies, and which should, by Proclamation to be from time to time published in the New South Wales Government Gazette, by order of the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, be declared and notified as such public Gaols, Prisons, or Houses of Correction, should from and after the publication of such notification, be severally deemed and taken to be the public Gaol, Prison, or House of Correction of the place or district where the same was or should be situated within the said Colony or its Dependencies respectively, and should be subject to the several provisions therein made for the regulation, management, care and discipline of the public Gaols, Prisons, and Houses of Correction belonging to the said Colony and its Dependencies, and of the prisoners confined within the same; and whereas there has been for some time in course of erection, as and for a public Gaol, the building called and known by the name of the New Gaol, at

Melbourne, Port Phillip, in the said Colony; and it is expedient that the said Gaol should be and be declared to be a public Gaol, Prison, and House of Correction:—

Now therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue of the said recited Act, and in pursuance of the power and authority thereby in me vested, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify, the said building at Melbourne, to be a public Gaol, Prison, and House of Correction.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign:

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury, are requested to furnish their accounts, through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers, in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively, up to that date, so that the entire revenue collected by each, may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received. The heads of departments and other officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

REQUISITIONS.

THE GOVERNOR has been pleased to rescind, the Regulations relative to Requisitions, dated 13th February, 1837, and to direct that the following be strictly attended to by the Civil Departments, the expenses of which are defrayed out of the Colonial Treasury:—

1st.—All requisitions are to be made in duplicate, in the prescribed form, for the different Offices and Departments in Sydney, *half-yearly*, on the 1st of December, and 1st of June; and for all Out-stations, Port Phillip District included, *annually*, on the 1st of December, and unless in cases of *great-urgency*, at no other period, except for Clothing for prisoners in the Gaols, or employed in the Colonial Departments, for which Estimates and Requisitions must be made as heretofore, agreeable to the Regulations of 21st January, 1839. The Requisitions prepared under the former Regulation for the Quarter commencing this day, will, however, be received by the Colonial Storekeeper, but it will be necessary, for the Departments in Sydney to forward to that Officer, without delay, Supplementary Requisitions for the remainder of the half-year, and for those at the Out-stations similar demands for the remainder of the year.

2nd.—Applications for repair, or whitewashing, of public Colonial buildings, and where land is attached, for the repair of gates, fences, and general maintenance of the premises in good order, and Requisitions for furniture for public Colonial buildings are to be made on the Colonial Architect.

3rd.—Requisitions for clothing, bedding, stationery, printed forms, and other description of store, are to be made on the Colonial Storekeeper.

4th.—Officers in charge of Departments are to include in their Requisitions, such articles only as are usually allowed, and absolutely necessary for the public service; to shew the date of last Requisition, the quantity in possession, and to give a correct description of the articles required, particularly as to size, weight, or measurement, when

necessary, and the service for which it is required, and to adhere as far as possible to the regulations in force on this head of Service.

5th.—Should stores, &c., or repairs to buildings be *urgently required*, during any intermediate period, a Supplementary Requisition is to be sent in to the proper officer, accompanied by a report of the necessity.

“That the Lessees shall be bound, within one month from the commencement of their respective Leases, to put into good plight, state, and condition, as to the repairs thereof, the Turnpike Gate or Ferry respectively leased to them, and all Houses, Erections, and Buildings, and as respects the said Ferries, including also all Punts, Boats, Chains, Ropes, and Appurtenances thereunto belonging, and to keep the same in the like state of repair during the whole term or period which the said Leases shall respectively endure; and at the end or sooner determination of the said term, shall surrender and yield up the Gates, Ferries, Buildings, Ves-

"sels, and Appurtenances, in a good plight, state, and condition, as to the repairs thereof; and if any one or more of the said Lessees shall fail so to do, the Lessee or Lessees so failing shall pay, along with his or their last month's Rents, such a sum or sums as shall be requisite to effect the repairs required, to be determined by the report of the Colonial Architect, or any other qualified person appointed to inspect the same under the authority of the Governor, which sum shall become and be a part of the Rent agreed to be paid for the said Toll or Ferry respectively; and shall be recoverable, in like manner, by distress and sale of the defaulter's goods and chattels, under a warrant to be issued by the said Colonial Treasurer, or the Colonial Treasurer of the Colony for the time being."
