· PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty. King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to consolidate and amend the laws for the "transportation of offenders in New South Wales, and for defining the respective powers und authori" ties of General Quarter Sessions, and of Petty "Sessions, and for determining the places at which the same shall be holden, and for better regulating "the summary jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace," and for repealing certain laws and ordinances re-"lating thereto," it was amongst other things enacted, that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions for the said Colony, should be holden at such times respectively, as the Governor for the time being should, by any Proclamation duly issued for such purpose appoint: Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that the said Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden during the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, at the several times and places hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

At Parramatta on Monday the 6th of January, Tuesday, the 1st of April, Tuesday, the 1st of July, and Wednesday, the 1st October.

At Maitland on Monday, the 13th of January, the 7th of April, the 7th of July, and the 6th of October.

At Sydney on Monday, the 3rd of February, the

28th of April, the 28th of July, and the 27th of October; and also by adjournments of such Sessions respectively on Tuesday, the 11th of March, the 10th of June, the 9th of September, and the 9th of December.

At Berrima on Thursday, the 27th of February, the 29th of May, the 28th of August, and the 27th of November.

At Bathurst on Thursday, the 20th of March, the 19th of June, the 18th of September, and the 18th of December.
