PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by a Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January last, the Legislative Council of this Colony was prorogued to Tuesday, the nineteenth day of March next, but circumstances have arisen to render an earlier meeting of the said Council expedient :-Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, do hereby alter the day to which the Legislative Council was by the said Proclamation prorogued; and I do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me as Governor of New South Wales, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for the Go-"vernment of New South Wales and Van Die-"men's Land," hereby announce and proclaim, that a Session of the said Legislative Council shall be holden on Tuesday, the fifth day of March next, instead of the said ninetcenth day of March, at twelve o'clock, at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, Sydney; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this 15th day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and in the seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign,
