PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January last, the Legislative Council of this Colony was prorogued to Tuesday, the nineteenth day of March next, but circumstances have arisen to render an earlier meeting of the said Council expedient:— Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, do hereby alter the day to which the Legislative Council was by the said Proclamation prorogued; and I do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me as Governor of New South Wales, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*," hereby announce and proclaim, that a Session of the said Legislative Council shall be holden on Tuesday, the fifth day of March next, instead of the said nineteenth day of March, at twelve o'clock, at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, Sydney; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this 15th day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and in the seventh year of Her Majesty's Reign,

SPECIMENS ILLUSTRATIVE of NATURAL HISTORY.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs the publication, for general information, of the following Despatch, from the Secretary of State, dated 1st September, 1843, enclosing an Order in Council, exempting from Duty "Specimens Illustrative of Natural History," on their importation into Her Majesty's Colonial Possessions.

SIR,

I have the honor to transmit to you herewith, an order made by her Majesty in Council, on the 23rd ultimo, exempting from duty specimens illus-

trative of Natural History, on their importation into Her Majesty's Colonial Possessions.

I have to desire that you will give publicity to this order in the Colony under your Government, and will take the necessary steps to insure its being carried into effect.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament, held in the 5th and 6th Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the Laws for the Regulations of the Trade of the British Possessions abroad," it was enacted, that there should be raised, levied, collected and paid to Her Majesty the several Duties of Customs, as the same are respectively set forth in figures in the Table of Duties thereafter contained, upon Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, not being the growth, production, or manufacture of the United Kingdom, or of any of the British Possessions in America, or of the Mauritius, or of any of the British Possessions within the limits of the East India Company's Charter, or the produce of any of the British Fisheries imported or brought into any of the British Possessions in America, or the Mauritius by Sea or Inland Carriage or Navigation; And whereas divers Articles are enumerated in the said Table of Duties, and certain Duties therein mentioned are therein made payable upon such Articles respectively: and the duty of 4 per centum ad valorem is made payable on Articles not enumerated, except such as are comprised or referred to in the Table of Exemptions subjoined to the said Table of Duties. And whereas it is also enacted by the said Act now in recital, that it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council, to be issued from time to time, to direct that any Article described in such Order, being an Article chargeable under this Act as an unenumerated Article with a Duty of 4 per centum ad valorem, shall be added to the list of Exemptions thereinbefore set forth, and shall be free from such Duty; and from and after the time mentioned in such Orders for the commencement of such Exemptions, not being less than six months from the date thereof, such Exemption shall take effect, and such Article shall thenceforth, while such Order shall continue in force, be free from such Duty accordingly; and any such Order may at any time be suspended or revoked by Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, by any other Order in Council.

AND WHEREAS specimens illustrative of Natural History, are not enumerated in the said Table of Duties, neither are they comprised or referred to in the said Table of Exemptions; and whereas Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, hath thought fit, for the encouragement of the study of Natural History, that specimens illustrative of Natu-

ral History should be exempted from the Duties imposed by the said recited Act.

Now, THEREFORE, under and by virtue of the said Act of Parliament, and in exercise of the powers thereby in Her Majesty in Council in that behalf vested, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council doth Order, and it is hereby Ordered accordingly that specimens illustrative of Natural History being Articles chargeable under the said Act with a Duty of 4 per centum ad valorem, shall be, and the same are hereby added to the list of Exemptions in the said recited Act set forth; and that, from and after the 1st day of February, 1844, the said Articles shall be free from such Duty as fully and effectually as if such Articles had been inserted and enumerated in the said Table at the time of passing the said Act.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honorable Lord Stanley, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

6TH VICTORIA.

No. 16.—"An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council."—[23rd February, 1843.]

No. 17.—An Act to amend an Act, passed in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to provide for the Trial by Jury, in Civil and Criminal Cases, in the Circuit and other Courts, to be holden within the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies."—[23rd February, 1843.]

No. 18.—"An Act to remove doubts in respect to the exercise of certain Powers by the Councils of the City of Sydney and Town of Melbourne, and to declare the competency of Witnesses, and the jurisdiction of Magistrates in certain cases within the same."—[23rd February, 1843.]
