PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,
Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the
Territory of New South Wales and its Dependen-
cies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, bearing date
the twenty-seventh day of January last,
the Legislative Council of this Colony was pro-
rogued to Tuesday, the nineteenth day of March
next, but circumstances have arisen to render an
earlier meeting of the said Council expedient :—
Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Go-
vernor of the Colony of New South Wales, do
hereby alter the day to which the Legislative
Council was by the said Proclamation pro-
rogued; and I do, by virtue of the power and
authority vested in me as Governor of New South
Wales, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of
Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and
6th year of the reign of Her present Majesty
Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act for the Go-
vernment of New South Wales and Van Die-
men's Land,*" hereby announce and proclaim,
that a Session of the said Legislative Council shall
be holden on Tuesday, the fifth day of March next,
instead of the said nineteenth day of March, at
twelve o'clock, at noon, in the Council Chamber,
situate in Macquarie-street, Sydney; and the
Members of the said Legislative Council are
hereby required to give their attendance at the
said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Govern-
ment House, Sydney, this 15th day
of February, in the year of Our
Lord one thousand eight hundred
and forty-four, and in the seventh
year of Her Majesty's Reign.

LAND & IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.

NOTICE is hereby given, that persons desirous of investing money on the security of the Territorial Revenue of this Government, can obtain Debentures at par on applying for them at this office.

The Debentures will be issued in even sums of one hundred pounds each, bearing interest at the rate of four-pence per one hundred pounds per diem, and will be of two kinds.

I. Debentures of which the principal and interest shall be payable in London.

- (1.) They will be current for three years, with liberty to be renewed for three years longer, at the option of the Government of New South Wales, three months' notice being given to that effect in the *London Gazette*.
- (2.) The interest will be paid half-yearly, on the presentation of the Debenture at the office of the Colonial Agent General, in London, on or after the first days of January and July in each year.
- (3.) If this Government shall desire to pay off the whole, or any portion of these Debentures, at the end of three years, notice to that effect shall be given three months previously in the *London Gazette*.
- (4.) These Debentures will be made out in duplicate, whereof the first will be delivered to the purchaser, and the second will be transmitted to the Colonial Agent General in London, by such opportunity as the purchaser may desire, to be used only, however, on due proof of the loss of the original.

II. Debentures of which the principal and interest shall be payable in the Colony.

- (1.) These will in like manner be current for three years, from the date of their issue, but will not be renewable for any further period.

- (2.) The interest will be paid quarterly, on the presentation of the Debenture at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, or Melbourne, on the first days of January, April, July, and October, respectively.

The Debentures of both kinds will be secured on the whole Territorial or Crown Revenue of the Colony, and will be taken in payment for land purchased from the Crown.
