**W**HEREAS the Legislative Council of this  
Colony now stands prorogued to Tuesday,  
the sixteenth day of April instant, and it is expedient  
further to prorogue the same,—Now, therefore, I,  
Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New  
South Wales, do hereby further prorogue the said  
Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twenty-eighth  
day of May next; and I do, by virtue of the power  
and authority vested in me, as Governor of New  
South Wales, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament  
of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and  
6th year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen  
Victoria, intituled "*An Act for the Government  
of New South Wales and Van Diemen's  
Land*," hereby announce and proclaim, that a  
Session of the said Legislative Council shall be  
holden on the aforesaid twenty-eighth day of May  
next, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the Council Chamber,  
situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney;  
and the Members of the said Legislative Council  
are hereby required to give their attendance at the  
said time and place accordingly.
