**SIXTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A
CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that the six convicts, whose names and descriptions are given below, effected

their escape from the Hospital at Newcastle, on the 21st instant, and having taken possession of the Cutter "Brothers," then at anchor at that port, proceeded to sea, and subsequently landed on the coast near the Seal Rock, about 36 miles to the north of Port Stephens, and that they are supposed to be making their way towards Moreton Bay; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of Ten Pounds will be paid to any reef person or persons who may apprehend and lodge in one of Her Majesty's Gaols, any of the said prisoners; and that if apprehended and secured by a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon:—

James Edwards, by the "Royal Admiral" 2; native place, Kent; trade, brass founder; height, 5 feet 2½ inches; complexion, sallow; hair, brown; eyes, dark brown.—Remarks:—Moon on right arm.

Henry Elgar, by the "Waterloo" 3; native place, Kent; age, 31; occupation, seaman and farm labourer; height, 5 feet 6 inches; complexion, fair; hair, brown; eyes, hazel.—Remarks:—several small moles on right arm.

Henry Hughes, by the "Exmouth"; age, 27; native place, London; occupation, errand boy; height, 4 feet 5¾ inches and upwards; complexion, ruddy, fair and freckled; hair, brown; eyes, grey.—Remarks:—indistinct blue marks on right arm, H on left, with dots, also between thumb and forefinger.
