THE following Rules of the Savings' Bank of New South Wales, framed at a meeting of the Trustees, held on the 14th instant, having been submitted to the GOVERNOR for his approval, and adopted, confirmed and allowed by His Excellency, agreeably to the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 3 Victoria, No. 12, section 9, are published for general information.

RULES OF THE SAVINGS' BANK OF NEW SOUTH WALES.

Meeting of Trustees.

I. That the Trustees do meet once in every week for the despatch of the current business of the Institution; and once in every month for examining and ascertaining its exact state and progress, and for receiving the monthly report of the accountant.

Attendance of Trustees to receive deposits and make repayments.

II. That one Trustee do attend on each day for receiving or repaying deposits, and do enter in a book, to be called "the Trustees' Book," the number and amount of every deposit or repayment, as the case may be, and at the close of the business of the day do compare the entries in such book with those of the accountant's or clerk's book, and ascertain that they both agree in all respects, and do thereupon sign the same; and also on the days for repayment of deposits, that such Trustee do ascertain the balance remaining in hand at the close of the business of the day, and do state and sign the same.

Regulations respecting deposits and repayments.

III. That no deposit be received or repaid, except during the regular office days and hours appointed for those purposes respectively, and in the presence of the Trustee in attendance; but in order to prevent inconvenience to parties who may not be resident in Sydney, that a sum not exceeding £100 be placed in the hands of the accountant to enable him to make such payments to depositors as he may deem absolutely necessary, such payments to be entered by the accountant and added to the Trustees' Book of the next day of payment.

Actual receipts to be paid into Bank where funds deposited.

IV. That the actual amount of all sums received by the Savings' Bank shall be forthwith paid unto the Banks with which their funds are deposited.

Withdrawal of money from Banks where funds deposited,

V. That no money belonging to the Savings' Bank shall be withdrawn from the Banks in which the same may be deposited, unless upon a draft sanc-

tioned at a Meeting of the Trusfees and signed by two of the Trustees then present, of whom the Chairman of such Meeting shall be one, and countersigned by the accountant.

Duties of Accountant.

VI. That it shall be the duty of the Accountant in Sydney, to attend the weekly, and all other Meetings of the Trustees, and to keep regular and distinct books of the whole affairs of the Bank, the transactions of which shall be duly entered and posted therein, as also the accounts of Depositors in the Districts, from lists furnished to him by the District Accountants; and the whole shall be regularly balanced on the Thirty-first day of December, in each year; exclusive of Trial balance. which, the trial balance, to the last day of the other three quarters of the year, shall likewise be prepared by him, on the close of each quarter; and also, that he shall examine the postings of all entries into the ledgers from the Trustees' book, and make a report of the same to the Meeting of the Trustees, to be held at the commencement of each Month: Monthly Report to Trustees, and also do furnish a monthly retees. port of all monies out-standing on

Mortgage or Bills, and of all monies received thereon for principal or interest respectively, and of the amount due on deposits of all descriptions, so that the Trustees may, at each of their monthly Meetings, be in possession of a full and detailed account of the liabilities and assets of the Bank.

Books to be kept.

VII. That the books to be kept shall consist of a rough and fair Cash Books, Journal, Bill Book, Interest Book, Ledgers, Trustees' Book, and Register of Mortgages, and a Minute Book, wherein shall be entered the Minutes of the proceedings of the Trustees at all their Meetings, and such other books and accounts as shall, from time to time, be directed by the Trustees at their monthly Meetings.

Preliminary proceedings for depositors.

VIII. That free persons becoming depositors in the Bank, must, on and previous to making their first deposit, disclose their names, professions, business, occupations, callings, and residences, and sign a declaration, acknowledging that they, or the person on whose behalf such deposit is made, have received due and full notice of the Rules and Regulations of the said Bank, and that the same are binding on them and their representatives.

Regulations for making deposits, and for repayment thereof.

IX. That all deposits and repayments are to be entered in the books of the Bank, and also in a deposit book or duplicate, to be given gratis to each depositor on opening an account with the Bank, and in which the sum received or paid on each occasion is to be entered in words at length, and signed with the initials of one Trustee and the Accountant; and whenever any business is transacted, the deposit book or duplicate must be produced; and in case any depositor shall lose the book or duplicate, immediate notice must be given to the Accountant, who, upon a satisfactory explanation being given of the loss, and payment of two shillings and sixpence in aid of the funds of

the Bank, will fill up another book or duplicate. to be copied from the depositors' account in the Bank ledger, and signed with the initials of the attendant Trustee, and of the Accountant; but if any money shall have been drawn from the Bank by any other person producing such book or duplicate, and representing himself or herself to be the Depositor mentioned therein, before such notice shall have been given to the Accountant; or if such Depositor shall fail or neglect altogether to give such notice, the loss shall fall on the Depositor so losing his or her book or duplicate.

Deposits on account of absent depositor.

X. That forms for signature may be had at the Bank Office, enabling persons who cannot attend, to sign the declaration appointed by the last rules;those who are already depositors may send the deposit Book, or duplicate and additional sum by other persons.

Regulations for withdrawing deposits.

XI. That depositors may receive the whole or any part of their money on giving due notice as follows :- If £50, or upwards, 3 months; under £50, 1 month: Provided, however, that they apply for payment at the days and hours fixed for making repayments to depositors. Payments can be made only to a depositor personally, and on his or her receipt, or to the bearer of an order signed by the depositor, and witnessed, if the depositor cannot write, but, as in other cases, the deposit voucher must also be produced. Forms of such orders may be obtained gratis, on application at the Bank Office. Depositors failing to claim the amount for which notice of withdrawal has been given at the time it expires, may, at the discretion of the Trustees, be required to give fresh notice before they will be entitled to receive the amount.

#### Return or rejection of deposit.

XII. That the Trustees reserve the option of returning or rejecting the deposits of any person or persons whom they may deem it inexpedient to continue or admit as a depositor.
