TWENTY POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on the afternoon of the above date, the undersigned was stopped and fired at by an armed bushranger, on the top of the Crawney Mountain, supposed to be George Crawford, alias Wilson. He was rather below the middle stature, brown hair, and dark complexion; he had on a Jim Crow hat, a blue Petersham coat, a pair of moleskin trousers, and carried a double barrel piece. He took away a chesnut mare, 4 years old, heavy in foal, branded M on the near side under the saddle, and T on the off shoulder, with a white star on her forehead and tip of her nose.
