## FORTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the evening of the 28th ultimo, the Coach conveying the Mail from Bathurst, was stopped at Honey Suckle Flat, about 20 miles from Bathurst, and the Mail Bags robbed by two armed men, who are supposed to be runaways from the service of Mr. Irving, at Kirkconnell; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may apprehend and lodge in one of Her Majesty's Gaols either of the said offenders; and that if apprehended and secured by a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be
