## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*," and in pursuance of the power delegated to me, by Her Majesty in that behalf, I did, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Colony, appoint certain persons to be Members of the Legislative Council, by the said Act, established; and whereas Hastings Elwin, Esquire, one of the persons named in such Letters Patent, hath, by a writing under his hand, addressed to me, resigned his seat in the said Legislative Council:—Now I, SIR GEORGE GIPPS, the Governor aforesaid, do hereby proclaim, that, in pursuance of the authority in me vested, I have, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Colony, bearing even date herewith, appointed JOHN BAYLEY DARVALL, Esquire, Barrister at Law, to be a Member of the said Legislative Council, in lieu of the said Hastings Elwin, Esquire, and until Her Majesty's pleasure shall be known.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS, in conformity with the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the making and repairing of Parish Roads in the Colony of New South Wales*," Trustees have been appointed for a Road, known as the Parish Road leading from Sydney to Mudbank, at Cook's River, in the County of Cumberland; and the said Trustees have, in accordance with the twenty-first section of such Act, certified that the said Parish Road is in a state to permit and allow the safe and uninterrupted passage of the Public with their carriages and other vehicles, and horses, and other cattle and stock; and it has further been made to appear, to the satisfaction of the Governor and Executive Council, that a sum of not less than two hundred and fifty pounds sterling, for each and every mile of the whole length of such Road, or in all about one thousand pounds has been expended thereon:—Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, appoint and direct Tolls to be demanded, levied, and taken upon the aforesaid Parish Road, leading from Sydney to Mudbank, at Cook's River, in the manner prescribed by the before recited Act, and at the Rates specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed; and further, that the Tolls so to be collected or levied upon such Parish Road, shall be paid to the Trustees thereof, to be by them laid out, employed and expended in the making, fencing, and repairing, and in keeping in repair, the said Road

and the Bridges thereon, and in keeping in proper repair the Toll Houses and Bars, and in the payment of the Collector of such Toll, and of such other necessary expenses,—of which all parties concerned are hereby required to take due notice.
