WHEREAS it has been represented to me that John Buchanan and William Holmes were, on or about the 24th instant, stopped on their way to Nelbourne from Mr. Burchett's out-station, in the Portland Bay District, by two armed men, who after having robbed them of a cheque for £21 4s. 6d. fired at and severely wounded each of them.—this outrage being understood to have been committed by Peter Stratton, a native of Van Diemen's Land, and another man an present unknown:—Notice is hereby given that a reward of twenty pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall apprehend and lodge either of the said offenders in any of her Majesty's gaols; and if either of the said parties be apprehended and secured by a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to her Majesty for the allowance to him of a conditional pardon.
