**PREMIUMS** being offered by the "Society for the encouragement of Arts, Manufactures, and Commerce," for the best specimens of Olive Oil and Wine, imported into England from Australia, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct the publication of the following extract from the advertisement of the Society, for general information:

### OLIVE OIL.

To the Person who shall manufacture and import the finest specimen of Oil, not less than Ten Gallons, the produce of Olives grown in any British colony in Africa, or Australia;—*the Gold Medal.*

Specimens of the Oil, not less than Two Quarts, together with satisfactory Certificates, to be produced to the Society.

**WINE FROM AUSTRALIA OR NEW ZEALAND.**  
To the Person who shall import the finest Wine, not less than one Pipe, of good marketable quality, made from the produce of Vineyards in Australia;—*the Gold Medal.*

Samples of the Wine, and Certificates that the Wine was made in the Colony, to be produced to the Society, together with an account of the Vineyard, and of the process of the manufacture.

It must be observed, that it is absolutely necessary that all statements made by Candidates residing in the Colonies, should be authenticated by the Certificates of the Governor or Secretary of the Colony, or by two Justices of the Peace, or other competent local authorities.

## Allowance to Witnesses.

HIS Excellency the Governor, in pursuance to a resolution passed by the Legislative Council during its late session, is pleased to direct that, from the present date, the following regulations shall be observed in the payment of allowances to witnesses summoned to attend the Supreme Court, Courts of Assize, and Quarter Sessions throughout the Colony, viz.:—  
1. No allowance whatever shall be made to any witness residing within five miles of the Court to which he may be summoned to attend. 2. To a witness residing beyond five miles, there shall be allowed only the sum of Two Shillings and Eight Pence for each day's attendance at any of the said Courts, and Six Pence per mile for every mile beyond five miles he may reside from the Court. 3. In cases where there is a regular steam conveyance, or the passage made by water, the allowance for travelling shall be limited to the actual amount of the passage money. 4. The allowance to Constables, Mounted Police, and Soldiers, summoned as witnesses, are to continue the same as at present established.
