REQUISITIONS.

THE Governor has been pleased to rescind the Regulations relative to Requisitions, dated 13th February, 1837, and to direct that the following be strictly attended to by the Civil Departments, the expenses of which are defrayed out of the Colonial Treasury :—

- 1st.—All Requisitions are to be made in Duplicate, in the prescribed form, for the different Offices and Departments in Sydney, *half yearly*, on the 1st of December and 1st of June; and for all Outstations, Port Phillip District included, *annually*, on the 1st of December, and unless in cases of *great urgency*, at no other period, except for clothing for prisoners in the Gaols, or employed in the Colonial Departments, for which Estimates and Requisitions must be made as heretofore, agreeably to the Regulation of 21st January, 1839. The Requisitions prepared under the former Regulation, for the Quarter commencing this day, will, however, be received by the Colonial Storekeeper, but it will be necessary for the Departments in Sydney to forward to that Officer, without delay, Supplementary Requisitions for the remainder of the half year, and for those at the Outstations similar demands for the remainder of the year.
- 2nd.—Applications for Repair or whitewashing of Public Colonial Buildings, and where Land is attached, for the Repair of Gates, Fences, and general maintenance of the Premises in good order, and Requisitions for Furniture for Public Colonial Buildings, are to be made on the Colonial Architect.
- 3rd.—Requisitions for Clothing, Bedding, Stationery, Printed Forms, and other description of Store, are to be made on the Colonial Storekeeper.
- 4th.—Officers in charge of Departments are to include in their Requisitions such articles only as are usually allowed, and absolutely necessary for the public service; to shew the date of last Requisition, the quantity in possession, and to give a correct description of the Articles required, particularly as to size, weight, or measurement, when necessary, and the Service for which it is required, and to adhere, as far as possible, to the Regulations in force on this Head of Service.
- 5th.—Should Stores, &c., or Repairs to Buildings be *urgently required*, during any inter-

mediate period, a Supplementary Requisition is to be sent in to the proper Officer, accompanied by a Report of the necessity.

LUNATIC ASYLUM.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that, under the 12th section of the Act of the Legislative Council, passed in the seventh year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to make provision for the safe custody of, and prevention of offences by, persons dangerously insane, and for the care and maintenance of persons of unsound mind," applications for the admission into the Lunatic Asylum, of persons who are insane, but not dangerously so, are to be accompanied by the following documents, viz:—

1st.—A Certificate from two legally qualified Medical Practitioners, that they have examined the person, and found him or her to be of unsound mind.

2nd.—The application must be made by one or more of the relatives or guardians of the insane person, which application must be sanctioned, in writing, by one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of New South Wales.

In all applications of this nature, the relationship in which the applicants stand to the insane person must be stated.

The applications, when complete, are to be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary.

The charge for the maintenance of an insane person (male or female) in the Lunatic Asylum, will be one shilling and nine-pence per diem; and unless the insane person be a pauper, the application for his or her admission must be accompanied by an engagement from two responsible persons (known to and approved by the Government) for the regular payment of this sum.

If the application be for the admission of the insane person as a pauper, proof must be adduced, not only that such person is without funds for his or her maintenance, or incapable of earning his or her own living, but that such insane person is also without friends, who can reasonably be expected, wholly or in part, to maintain such person.

If it be made to appear that the insane person has friends, who can in part, although not wholly pay for his or her maintenance, the charge of 1s. 9d. per diem may be reduced by order of His Excellency the Governor.

Pilotage Port Phillip—See Act 7, Vict.  
No. 12.

**A**ND be it enacted, That the rates and charges of pilotage on all ships and vessels arriving in the harbour of Port Phillip, from any distance not less than two leagues at sea, or departing therefrom to a like distance at sea, shall be the same as are respectively inserted, described, and set forth in figures in the schedule to this Act annexed, marked B, subject, however, to the reductions and exemptions therein contained.

EXCEPTIONS OR EXEMPTIONS.

1. Vessels of all nations outfitting to, or refitting from the fisheries; and vessels and steamers engaged in the coasting trade between Port Phillip and any part of South Wales and Van Diemen's Land; and also all vessels under 30 tons burthen, may decline taking pilots, but must nevertheless pay one-fourth of the above rates.

2. Vessels above 30, but under 50 tons burthen, not being steamers, nor engaged in the coasting trade, may also decline to take pilots, but must nevertheless pay one-half of the above rates.

All vessels actually taking pilots must pay full pilotage; and the above exceptions or exemptions apply only to vessels having British registers, or being entitled to the privileges of British registered vessels.

**Allowance to Witnesses.**

HIS Excellency the Governor, in pursuance to a resolution passed by the Legislative Council during its late session, is pleased to direct that, from the present date, the following regulations shall be observed in the payment of allowances to witnesses summoned to attend the Supreme Court, Courts of Assize, and Quarter Sessions throughout the Colony, viz.:—

1. No allowance whatever shall be made to any witness residing within five miles of the Court to which he may be summoned to attend.
2. To a witness residing beyond five miles, there shall be allowed only the sum of Two Shillings and Eight Pence for each day's attendance at any of the said Courts, and Six Pence per mile for every mile beyond five miles he may reside from the Court.
3. In cases where there is a regular steam conveyance, or the passage made by water, the allowance for travelling shall be limited to the actual amount of the passage money.
4. The allowance to Constables, Mounted Police, and Soldiers, summoned as witnesses, are to continue the same as at present established.

It must be observed, that it is absolutely necessary that all statements made by Candidates residing in the Colonies, should be authenticated by the Certificates of the Governor or Secretary of the Colony, or by two Justices of the Peace, or other competent local authorities.
