HIS Excellency the Governor having had under consideration the necessity of reducing the expenses of the Department of the Surveyor-General, and at the same time of affording to public bodies, as well as private individuals, the means of obtaining, at their own expense, surveys of land, and reports on disputed boundaries, which if previously authorised by the Government, will be received as official, —as also projects for the opening of new Roads, or for the execution of any other kind of public work, has been pleased to appoint the under-mentioned Officers of the Surveyor-General's Department to be Licensed Surveyors in the following Districts:—

These Officers are authorised to act as Surveyors, or Agents for private individuals, and every facility will be afforded them in so doing by the various Departments of Government. Applications for the purchase or occupation of Land may also be made through them, though the Government will reserve to itself, as at present, the discretion of acting or not on such applications.

His Excellency has also been pleased to appoint the above Officers to be Commissioners of Crown Lands, for the purpose of acting within their respective Districts. The limits of their Districts will hereafter be more distinctly announced.
