THEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that about four o'clock on the afternoon of the 21st instant, the Mail was stopped at a place situated between Bungonia and Lake Bathurst, by two armed men, and robbed of the letter bags from Queanbeyan, Bungendore, and Braidwood; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons, who may give such infor-mation as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the parties guilty of the above outrage; and if the person giving the said information, be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.
