## TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that about four o'clock on the afternoon of the 21st instant, the Mail was stopped at a place situated between Bungonia and Lake Bathurst, by two armed men, and robbed of the letter bags from Queanbeyan, Bungendore, and Braidwood; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons, who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the parties guilty of the above outrage; and if the person giving the said information, be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.
