TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that the Coach carrying the Mails from the Southern Districts, was stopped yesterday, the 19th instant, at Razorback, by two armed men, who, after robbing the passengers, removed the Letter Bags from Marulan, Bungonia, Braidwood, Bungendore, Queanbeyan, Berrima, and Picton, for Sydney, and the Bags from Berrima, Goulburn,

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the 14th instant, two wool drays belonging to Mr. Kirwan, of Coomer, while passing Lake George, were attacked by four men mounted and armed, who turned the drays off the road into the bush, and finally succeeded in making off with one of them, and its burthen, (the other having been left at some distance;) His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may give such information as may lead to the apprehension of the guilty parties; and if the person giving the said information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such prisoner of the Crown.

SHED ON THE CIRCULAR QUAY.

THE following Rules for regulating the use of the Shed on the Circular Wharf, having been prepared by the Collector of Customs, and approved by the Governor, are published, as required by the 6th section of the Act of Council, 8 Victoria, No. 16, and will take effect from and after the expiration of one month from this date.

REGULATIONS FOR THE SHED ON THE CIRCULAR QUAY.

No. 1.—The Shed to be open for the use of the public, free of all charge, from Seven o'clock a.m.; till Five o'clock p.m., every day, Sundays excepted, from the 1st October to the 31st March; and from Eight o'clock a.m., till Four o'clock p.m., from 1st April to 30th September.

No. 2.—One portion of the Shed at the north-east corner to be reserved for the re-coopering of oil, each party making use of it for that purpose, to clean up and remove all refuse or filth, within twelve hours after the work is performed.

No. 3.—No oil of vitriol, turpentine, spirits of tar, or other highly combustible article, nor any molasses to be stored.

No. 4.—No wool press to be put up within the Shed.

No. 5.—Goods on importation not to be allowed to remain in store more than forty-eight hours.

No. 6.—No goods imported which are liable to duty to be stored until duly entered at the Custom House and the duty paid thereon.

No. 7.—No goods from the bonding warehouses or for drawback to be stored.

No. 8.—Goods for exportation not to remain in store more than six days, if required to be moved after that period.

No. 9.—No goods in bulk to be stored.

No. 10.—All persons storing goods, particularly bales of wool, are to stow the packages over each other as high as may be safe or practicable, so as to take no more room than is absolutely necessary, and to obey all such directions in this respect, as may be deemed necessary by the wharfinger or other Officer of Customs on duty at the Quay.

No. 11.—No lights to be used in the Shed, nor any smoking allowed.

No. 12.—Any person who may offend against any of these Regulations, is liable under the 5th sec. of the 8th Victoria, No. 16, on summary conviction before a Justice of the Peace, to forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £5.

BYE LAW, No. 7.

BY THE DISTRICT COUNCIL OF GRANT.

Bye Law for imposing a rate of twelve pence in the pound sterling, for general purposes, on all lands and tenements, sheep, cattle, and horses, (exclusive of the property of the Crown, and of the stock depastured upon purchased lands,) within the District of Grant.

Whereas it was provided for in clause I, of Bye Law, No. 4, of the District Council of Grant, that a rate, for general purposes, of twelve pence in the pound sterling, should be assessed and levied on the annual value of all lands and tenements, sheep, cattle, and horses, within the District of Grant, (exclusive of the property of the Crown, and of stock depastured upon purchased lands,) in accordance with the valuation of such property by the assessors appointed by the Council, under the authority of Bye Law, No. 1 of the said Council: and whereas the said Council were unable to appoint Assessors in conformity with the provisions of the said Bye Law, No. 1.

Be it therefore ordered by the District Council of Grant, in Council assembled, in virtue of the authority vested in the said Council, by the Act 5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 76, confirmed by letters patent, under the hand of His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, and the seal of the said Colony, subject to the provisions of the said Act and Charter:

That the said rate of twelve pence in the pound sterling, shall be imposed and levied upon the annual value of all lands and tenements, sheep, cattle, and horses within the District of Grant, (exclusive of the property of the Crown, and of stock depastured upon purchased lands,) in accordance with the valuation of such property by the Assessors appointed by the Council, under the authority of Bye Law, No. 6 of the said Council, such valuation being subject to appeal, as provided for in Bye Law, No. 1 of the Council; and that the said rate shall become due on 31st day of March, in the present year, anything in Bye Law, No. 4, to the contrary notwithstanding.
