SYDNEY STREETS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to continue certain streets to the Semicircular Quay in Sydney Cove, and also to open two other streets in connection therewith, Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 4th William IV, No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, and improving the roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the streets in the towns thereof," a survey and tracing shewing the intended line of the said streets, are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit, in writing, to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within *one month* from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the continuation and formation of the said streets, namely,

1. MACQUARIE-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Bent-street, to the South Shore of Port Jackson, at the mouth of Sydney Cove.
2. PHILLIP-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Bent-street to the Circular Quay, passing through the eastern end of the present Government House.
3. ELIZABETH-STREET, in continuation of the present street to the east side of the Queen's Warehouse, but comprehending only the portion of it which lies between Bent-street and the Quay.
4. CASTELREAGH-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Hunter-street to the Circular Quay, by the west side of the proposed western wing of the New Custom House.
5. PITT-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Hunter-street to the Circular Quay, to a

point near the north-east corner of Wilson's Store, adjoining the stairs at the Queen's Wharf.

6. BRIDGE-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Macquarie-place to Macquarie-street.

7. ALBERT-STREET, leading at right angles from Macquarie-street to Phillip-street.

8. ALFRED-STREET, being in continuation of Albert-street, leading from the Wharf to Pitt-street.

In reference, however, to the line proposed for the continuation of Castlereagh-street, it is to be understood, that the Government does not pledge itself to remove the building now used as the Treasury ~~within a reasonable period~~ for the erection of another building shall have been provided by the Legislature.

FERRY AT MORETON BAY.

A Ferry having been established between Kangaroo Point and North Brisbane, at Moreton Bay, the dues arising from the same will be put up to Auction by the Police Magistrate, at the Police Office, in Brisbane, on Wednesday, the 10th day of January, 1845, at 12 o'clock, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of February, 1845. Upset price £10 per annum.

The lessee will be required to provide a sufficient Ferry Boat or Punt to convey, at all times, passengers, horses, carriages, &c., across the river, and to keep the same in suitable repair at his own expense.

A bond (in double the amount of the rent,) with two responsible sureties, will be required, for the due observance of the conditions of the lease, and the regular payment of the rent by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, together with a warrant of attorney.
