CORONERS.

SOME misapprehension being entertained as to the limits within which the several Coroners throughout the Colony should exercise their jurisdiction, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that in future, no Coroner is to act except within the Police District in which he may reside, and for which he is to be understood as holding his appointment.

In Police Districts in which there may be no Coroners, the inquiries into the causes of any sudden deaths which may happen within the same, are to be conducted by the Police Magistrate, (if there be one,) or if not, by any Justice of the Peace of the District, under the powers granted by the Act of the Governor and Council, 1 Victoria, No. 3.
