SYDNEY STREETS.

IIS Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Conneil, having deemed it expedient to continue certain streets to the Semicircular Quay in Sydney Cove, and also to open two other streets in connection therewith, Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 4th William IV, No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, and "improving the roads thoughout the Colony of New "South Wales, and for opening and improving the streets in the towns thereof," a survey and tracing shewing the intended line of the said streets, are now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit, in writing, to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the continuation and formation of the said streets, namely,

1. MACQUARIE-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Bent-street, to the South Shore of

Port Jackson, at the mouth of Sydney Cove.
2. PHILLIF-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Bent-street to the Circular Quay, passing through the eastern end of the present Government

3. ELIZABETH-STREET, in continuation of the present street to the east side of the Queen's Warehouse, but comprehending only the portion of it which lies between Bent-street and the Quay.

4. Castelreagh-street, in prolongation of the present street from Hunter-street to the Circular Quay, by the west side of the proposed western wing of the New Custom House.

5. PITT-STREET, in prolongation of the present street from Hunter-street to the Circular Quay, to a

point near the north-east corner of Wilson's Store adjoining the stairs at the Queen's Wharf.

6. BRIDGE-STREET, in prolongatio. f the present

street from Macquarie-place to Macq rie-street.
7. ALBERT-STREET, leading at right angles from Macquarie-street to Phillip-street.

8. ALFRED-STREET, being in continuation of Albert-street, leading from the Wharf to Pitt-street. In reference, however, to the line proposed for the continuation of Castlereagh-street; it is to be understood, that the Government does not pledge itself to remove the building now used as the Treasury within a less period than five years; or until funds for the erection of another building shall have been provided by the Legislature.

TEN POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-DITIONAL PARDON:

REWARD OF A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

THEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that early on the morning of the 27th December last, a violent outrage was committed at the dwelling house of the Reverend Michael O'Reilly, at Bathurst, by some person or persons -unknown, who discharged fire arms loaded with shot, &c., into Mr. O'Reilly's bed room; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that in addition to the pecuniary Reward offered by the Inhabitants of the District of Bathurst, to any person or persons who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the perpetrators of the outrage, in the event of the party giving the said information being a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.
