#### REWARD OF A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that early on the morning of the 27th December last, a violent outrage was committed at the dwelling house of the Reverend Michael O'Reilly, at Bathurst, by some person or persons unknown, who discharged fire arms loaded with shot, &c., into Mr. O'Reilly's bed room; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that, in addition to the pecuniary Reward offered by the Inhabitants of the District of Bathurst, to any person or persons who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the perpetrators of the outrage, in the event of the party giving the said information being a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.
