PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for the government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*," it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council by the said Act constituted, shall have authority to make laws for the peace, welfare, and good government of the said Colony; and that every Bill which has been passed by the said Council, and also every law proposed by the Governor, which shall have been passed by the said Council, whether with or without amendments, shall be presented for Her Majesty's assent to the Governor of the said Colony, and the Governor shall declare, according to his discretion, but subject, nevertheless, to the provisions contained in the said recited Act, and to such instructions as may from time to time be given in that behalf by Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, that he assents to such Bill in Her Majesty's name, or that he withholds Her Majesty's assent, or that he reserves such Bill for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon; and it is thereby further enacted, that no Bill which shall be so reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New South Wales, until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify, either by Speech or Message to the Legislative Council of the said Colony, or by Proclamation in the New South Wales Government Gazette, that such Bill has been laid before Her

Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same; and further, that no Bill which shall be so reserved as aforesaid, shall have any force or authority in the said Colony, unless Her Majesty's assent thereto shall be so signified as aforesaid, within the space of two years from the day on which such Bill shall have been presented for Her Majesty's assent to the Governor as aforesaid; and whereas the said Legislative Council did, in the month of November one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, pass a Bill, intituled, "*An Act to enable the Members of a certain Institution in the Colony of New South Wales, denominated 'the Sydney Dispensary,' to sue and be sued in the name of the Treasurer for the time being, and for other purposes therein mentioned*," which Bill was, agreeably to the provisions of the above recited Act, reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, as such Governor aforesaid, do, by this my proclamation, signify and declare, that the Right Honorable Lord Stanley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has transmitted to me an Order made by Her Majesty in Council, confirming, ratifying, and finally enacting the said Act, which will take effect accordingly from the date hereof.

Given under my hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this fourteenth day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of Her Majesty's Colony of New South Wales, did, in the month of November, 1843, pass a Bill which has been reserved by the Governor of the said Colony for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure, and has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz. :—

"An Act to enable the Members of a certain Institution in the Colony of New South Wales, denominated 'The Sydney Dispensary,' to sue and be sued in the name of the Treasurer for the time-being, and for other purposes therein mentioned."

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to trade and foreign plantations; and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should receive Her Majesty's special confirmation :—Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her special confirmation of the said Act, and the same is hereby specially confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted accordingly; whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the time-being of Her Majesty's Colony of New South Wales, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

SIR,

I shall feel much obliged by your Excellency having the goodness to make publicly known within the Australian Colonies, that the Government of Hong Kong will grant the right of pasturing, (free of rent,) to any fit person who may be desirous of introducing Sheep or Cattle into the Island, where the price of mutton in the market is, at present, half a dollar a pound. No period will be fixed for any particular tenancy; but the tenant will have twelve months notice before being required to remove.

A Bye-Law to amend the Bye-Law for regulating the traffic on the Market Wharf, in the City of Sydney.

WHEREAS on the first day of April, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, a certain Bye-law was made and passed by the Council of the City of Sydney, in Council assembled, for regulating the traffic on the Market Wharf, in the City of Sydney; and whereas by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and intituled, "An Act to declare the town of Sydney to be a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof," it is amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the said Council of the

said city, to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal, such Bye-laws or regulations as to them should seem meet, for the purposes and in the manner therein mentioned: And whereas it is necessary to repeal certain portions of the hereinbefore mentioned Bye-law; and substitute other provisions in lieu thereof: Be it therefore ordered, declared, and enacted, by the Council of the said City, in Council assembled, as follows:—

1.—That from and after the coming of this Bye-law into force, so much of the said Bye-law as empowers a charge of one penny per bushel or basket on fruit, green or dried, on landing at the Market Wharf, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

2.—That in addition to the fees named in the schedule to the before-mentioned Bye-law appended, the fees in the schedule annexed hereto, shall be paid at the said wharf, to the wharfinger appointed by the Council of the said City, who shall be authorised to receive the same; Provided that no charge shall be made for manure or fruit.

Passed the Council of the City of Sydney, the 24th day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, when twenty Members were present, being upwards of two-thirds of the whole number of the Council.
