SYDNEY STREETS AND SEMICIRCULAR QUAY.

WITH reference to the Government Notices bearing date the 6th day of January, and the 18th day of February, 1845, relative to the prolongation of certain streets to the Semicircular Quay, Sydney Cove, and to the opening of two other streets in connection therewith, and to the opening and making of a portion of the said Semicircular Quay; His Excellency the Governor, in conformity with the provisions of the Act of Council, 4 William IV., No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the streets in the towns thereof*," having, on the 31st day of March last, brought under the consideration of the Executive Council, the objections made to the opening of certain of the said streets, is pleased, with the advice of the said Council, to declare, that it is expedient to prolong, open, and make the several streets and portion of the Semicircular Quay hereinafter specified, according to a survey and tracing thereof, to be seen in the Office of the Surveyor General, that is to say:—

1.—Macquarie-street, in prolongation of the present street, from Bent-street to the South Shore of Port Jackson, at the mouth of Sydney Cove.

2.—Phillip-street, in prolongation of the present street, from Bent-street to the Circular Quay, passing through the eastern end of the present Government House.

3.—Elizabeth-street, in continuation of the present street to the east side of the Queen's Warehouse, but comprehending only the portion of it which lies between Bent-street and the Quay.

4.—Castlereagh-street, in prolongation of the present street, from Hunter-street to the Circular

Quay, by the west side of the proposed western wing of the new Custom House.

5.—Pitt-street, in prolongation of the present street, from Hunter-street to the Circular Quay, to a point near the north-east corner of Wilson's store, adjoining the stairs at the Queen's Wharf.

6.—Bridge-street, in prolongation of the present street, from Macquarie-place to Macquarie-street.

7.—Albert-street, leading at right-angles, from Macquarie-street to Phillip-street.

8.—Alfred-street, being in continuation of Albert-street, leading from the wharf to Pitt-street.

9.—Portion of the Semicircular Quay, commencing at the north-west corner of section No. 100, and bounded on the south by the northern boundary of that section; on the west by the eastern boundary of the same section, to the northern side of Alfred-street; and again on the south by the said northern side of Alfred-street, to its intersection with the line in continuation of Castlereagh-street; and on the north and north-east by the waters of Sydney Cove, as shewn upon the plan deposited in the Surveyor General's Office.

In reference, however, to the line proposed for the continuation of Castlereagh-street, it is to be understood, that the Government does not pledge itself to remove the building now used as the Treasury within a less period than five years, or until funds for the erection of another building shall have been provided by the Legislature.

SIR,

I shall feel much obliged by your Excellency having the goodness to make publicly known within the Australian Colonies, that the Government of Hong Kong will grant the right of pasturing, (free of rent,) to any fit person who may be desirous of introducing Sheep or Cattle into the Island, where the price of mutton in the market is, at present, half a dollar a pound. No period will be fixed for any particular tenancy; but the tenant will have twelve months notice before being required to remove.

A Bye-Law to amend the Bye-Law for regulating the traffic on the Market Wharf, in the City of Sydney.

WHEREAS on the first day of April, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, a certain Bye-law was made and passed by the Council of the City of Sydney, in Council assembled, for regulating the traffic on the Market Wharf, in the City of Sydney; and whereas by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, and intituled, "An Act to declare the town of Sydney to be a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof," it is amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the said Council of the said city, to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal; such Bye-laws or regulations as to them should seem meet, for the purposes and in the manner therein mentioned: And whereas it is necessary to repeal certain portions of the hereinbefore mentioned Bye-law; and substitute other provisions in lieu thereof: Be it therefore ordered, declared, and enacted, by the Council of the said City, in Council assembled, as follows:—

1.—That from and after the coming of this Bye-law into force, so much of the said Bye-law as empowers a charge of one penny per bushel or basket on fruit, green or dried, on landing at the Market Wharf, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

2.—That in addition to the fees named in the schedule to the before-mentioned Bye-law appended, the fees in the schedule annexed hereto, shall be paid at the said wharf, to the wharfinger appointed by the Council of the said City; who shall be authorised to receive the same; provided that no charge shall be made for manure or fruit.

Passed the Council of the City of Sydney, the 24th day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five; when twenty Members were present, being upwards of two-thirds of the whole number of the Council.
